
BOOT CAMP

Prajatantra brings insightful Knowledge Sessions for participants featuring key note speaker experts from Urban Governance. This year we conducted four insightful knowledge sessions:



Knowledge Session 1: City Governance: Legal & Institutional Framework:

In this session, expert speaker P.D. Hari Prasad, former Deputy Controller of Accounts, East Delhi Municipal Corporation delved into various aspects, such as the functions of Municipal Corporations, the significance of Municipal Acts, and the intricacies of Mayor elections. On the other hand, Tikender Singh Panwar Author and former Deputy Mayor of Shimla city discussed the crucial role and responsibilities of a Mayor within a city's administrative landscape. He emphasised the importance of the 74th Amendment Act and its pivotal role in the nation's governance framework.

Knowledge Session 2: Role of Youth to Ensure Water Secure Urban Ecosystem:

In this session, expert speaker Prof Tushar Bose, Associate Professor, Faculty of Technology, CEPT University, Ahmedabad shared valuable tips for participants aiming to develop better policies for the upcoming Prajatantra 2023 competitions.

He discussed water management projects implemented in Ahmedabad and shed light on urban and rural schemes/projects of some Indian cities to tackle water-related issues like floods and water scarcity, and how youth can play a vital role in it. The session was moderated by Lovlesh Sharma, Head, Urban Youth Unit (uYu) National Institute of Urban Affairs.

Knowledge Session 3: Municipal Finance:

In this session, the expert speaker Dr. Debarpita Roy, a Research Fellow at the Centre for Social and Economic Progress (CSEP) in New Delhi provided valuable insights on fundamental concepts and general trends of municipal finance in India. She also highlighted important aspects to be considered while drafting policies for model city government, pertaining to upcoming competitions of Prajatanra 2023.

On the other hand, Dr. Ravikant Joshi, an expert in Urban Finance and Management and a Former Chief Accounts Officer of Vadodara Municipal Corporation, highlighted the significance of citizen participation in local government.

POLICY PRESENTATION

In the Qualifying Round, we conducted two rounds of Policy Presentation Competition; the first was on Policy Presentation Urban Economy and the second was on Municipal Finance.

URBAN ECONOMY

In the Urban Economy, participants were tasked with presenting policies aimed at fostering economic growth within urban areas. They proposed a range of strategies to stimulate economic growth and promote entrepreneurship.

One notable suggestion was to introduce tax incentives and grants for startups, small businesses, and industries that create local job opportunities. By providing financial support and reducing tax burdens on these entities, the participants aimed to encourage economic growth and foster entrepreneurship. This approach would not only stimulate job creation but also contribute to the overall economic vitality of the region.

Another noteworthy proposal centred on the development and marketing of sustainable tourism attractions. Participants emphasised the importance of preserving local heritage and natural assets while simultaneously generating revenue and employment opportunities through tourism. By promoting sustainable tourism, they envisioned a scenario where the unique cultural and natural features of the area could be harnessed to benefit both the local economy and the community.

Overall, the policy presentation competition showcased the participants' commitment to finding innovative solutions while maintaining a focus on sustainability, job creation, and need for the fiscal empowerment of city government.





MUNICIPAL FINANCE

The event was a platform for participants to present their vision with respect to the budgeting of an urban local body. The participants were asked to suggest new revenue sources for municipal governments and to discuss how these new revenue sources could be used to improve the delivery of essential services.

The participants put forth several thoughtful suggestions, including the use of municipal bonds for revenue generation, investments in public transport to alleviate traffic congestion and increase revenue for the corporation, and a focus on solid waste management charges.

The policy presentation was a success. It was a great way for participants to learn about the different ways to budget for an urban local body and to suggest new revenue sources.


