

CALL FOR PROPOSAL: Public Health (Women and Youth)

The Friedrich Naumann Stiftung für die Freiheit (FNF) is the coordinating authority under the European Instrument for Capacity Development and Promotion of Diversity for Inclusive, Sustainable Growth in India (DCI-NSAPVD/2015/368-620) for the action titled 'Enabling civil society to build accountable and transparent governance in Mumbai & Delhi'. The implementing partner under the European Union funded project is Praja Foundation based in Mumbai and having an office in New Delhi (<http://www.praja.org/>).

PRAJA ORGANISATION OVERVIEW

Praja is a non-partisan voluntary organization enabling accountable governance. Praja empowers citizens to participate in governance by providing knowledge and perspective so that they can become politically active and involved beyond the ballot box. It undertakes extensive research and highlights civic issues to build the awareness of, and mobilize action by the government and elected representatives.

Purpose: A part objective of this project is to assist young or emerging organisations working in the areas of public health to leverage technology to increase knowledge and awareness of women and youth on health-based issues.

Funding & Timeline:

This call for proposal is for a sub-grant of up to a maximum of 10,000 Euros for a period of 12 months from 1st January 2019 till 31st December 2019.

The proposal must include the following aspects:

- The organisation will work in the domain of public health.
- The organisation will leverage technology to augment knowledge, awareness and access of women and youth to public health policies and programs.

- Engage in capacity building of the citizens (especially women) to make them understand basic primary healthcare needs and provisions made by the government with respect to various public health schemes.
- To identify, create and work on public health delivery model which can be scalable in Mumbai & Delhi.
- Organisation which have had experience and are currently working in the sectors of primary health care in India, providing access and educating the citizens on the same.

Eligibility:

- Previous experience (preferably at least three years) in working the on issues of public health service delivery and awareness.
- The organisation should have a Foreign Contribution Regulation Act (FCRA) clearance.
- CSO will be asked to submit a detailed project proposal and a detailed budget for “applying” for a sub-grant.

Deadline:
