# About PRAJA



Over the last 26 years, Praja has been working towards enabling accountable governance. We conduct data-driven research on civic issues inform citizens, media, and government administration and work with elected representatives to equip them to address inefficiencies in their work processes, bridging the information gaps, and mobilising them in taking corrective measures advocating for change.

In the past we have partnered with the Mumbai Corporation to come up with its first Citizen Charter to revamp their Citizens' Complaint Grievances Mechanism and handholding them to run it in the initial years; we come up with annual white papers on the performances of civic, health, crime, education and housing issues in Mumbai and Delhi; since 2011 we have been coming up with an annual report card to rank performances of MLAs and Councillors in Mumbai and (since 2016) Delhi. We do not just stop at creating standardised matrixes or governance indicators but also support building capacities of elected representatives, executives and citizens by coming up with various handbooks on governance and conducting numerous workshops/trainings on governance issues.

Currently, Praja has multiple partnerships with various government bodies for initiatives such as enhancing municipal laws/regulations, capacity building of elected representatives, advisory support on enhancing municipal finances, building civic tech platforms and so on.

In a nutshell, Praja works as a catalyst to transform a 'smart city' into a 'smartly governed city' by influencing policy change at a structural and systemic level to democratise city governments and improve the delivery of services.

# 1.1. WHY CITIES MATTER?

Development of any civilisation is closely linked to cities, which have been the anchors of aspirations. Cities offer better economic opportunities, improved access to essential services like education and healthcare, and a cosmopolitan environment that fosters inclusivity, and equity thus leading to development. Hence, how we manage India's rapid urbanisation is going to be the key to shaping the future of our nation.

In the post-Covid-19 world, we are at a critical juncture. The pandemic exposed the multi-layered weaknesses of Indian cities, revealing their inability to manage an emergency. The first wave of the pandemic saw economic activities come to a standstill, particularly in the medium, small, and micro industries. This experience has underscored the urgent need to rethink and reconfigure our cities to withstand future challenges.

Empowering city governments is going to be the crucial step towards ensuring that citizens have access to the best possible public services and amenities while also mitigating challenges. With the right policies and strategies in place, municipal corporations can be empowered to deliver better services. This in turn will prompt the nation's economic growth and address inequalities.

However, Indian cities are in dire need of structural reforms, which can only be achieved through a coordinated effort by the union, state, and city governments. Key areas of focus should include enabling local elected representatives to understand the technicalities of governance and how they can form policies, and also empowering cities to access

resources to implement those policies. These measures will not only make our cities more liveable but will also enhance the overall quality of life for their citizens. The success of these interventions will depend on the commitment of all stakeholders to work together. Internationally, we see that in regions where local governments are empowered to make decisions, economic development has been more rapid and sustained. Global metropolises comparable to Indian megacities often function as self-autonomous entities, a model that Indian cities should strive to emulate.

As urbanisation continues to grow, we must harness its potential to bring about positive change by involving its stakeholders actively. Cities are at the heart of societal growth, and their influence on the modern era can be encapsulated by two words: 'Citizen' in English and 'Prajā or Nagarik' in its Indian counterpart. It is imperative to build city governance structures that will hold the voice of the citizens at its core. This can be done only by democratically empowering our cities, their leadership (both elected and appointed), as well as citizens.

The opportunity before us is immense. The post-pandemic world has provided a clear signal: to rebuild our cities in a way that not only addresses their current weaknesses but also prepares them for the future. As India sets its sights on becoming a developed nation by 2047, it is clear that this ambition can only be realised through strong, resilient, and developed urban centres that will lead the way in shaping the nation's development agenda.

# 1.2. HOW DOES UGI CONTRIBUTE TO TRANSFORMING CITIES?

As India progresses towards a \$5 trillion economy, the role of urban centres becomes more crucial. It is not just a question of economic progress; it is also the opportunity to enhance the quality of life in our cities and make them more sustainable. Recognising the importance of cities in this national journey, the Honourable Prime Minister, in his 2024 Independence Day Address, called upon all city governments to implement at least two reforms annually. This directive is aligned with the mission of the Urban Governance Index (UGI), which seeks to promote a systematic approach to improving urban governance across the nation.

Launched in 2020, the Urban Governance Index has emerged as a crucial tool for policymakers. It provides comprehensive data, insights, and recommendations that are consistently referenced by key government bodies both at the union and state level, such as the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA), NITI Aayog, National Institute of Urban Affairs (NIUA), and state level Ministries/Departments of Urban Development in their policymaking processes. For instance, in 2022, when the Prime Minister's Office tasked MoHUA to draft suggestions to improve urban governance, MOHUA referred to the UGI data to draft three policy papers on India's urbanisation—focusing on political and civic administrative structures, municipal finance, and citizen-centric service delivery systems. The resulting documents were presented to the Prime Minister at the Chief Secretaries Conference in 2022, marking a significant step forward in the nation's urban governance agenda.

Increasingly, governments are embracing the recommendations of the UGI. Active steps taken to augment Municipal Finance, are among the most visible efforts. MoHUA is driving various programmes in this direction, and cities too are exploring market

borrowings. Another key reform being adopted by many states is the integration of technology into city governance. This has not only improved the accessibility of government services but also increased accountability. City governments across the country have developed functional websites that allow citizens to easily access information about their local governments. In several cities, citizens can also lodge complaints online. Cities like Bhubaneswar, Chandigarh, and Srinagar have taken a step further by creating portals where citizens can register their suggestions on improving civic services & infrastructure, thus improving public participation in governance.

While it is encouraging to see governments at all levels taking steps to enhance urban governance structures, significant challenges remain. One of the most pressing issue is the delay as well as irregularity in holding municipal elections across many states. Our great metropolises like Mumbai and Bengaluru have been functioning without an elected local government for the last few years. This raises the critical question about how the voices of citizens can be reflected in public decision-making, especially on crucial issues such as the expenditure of public funds and infrastructure development, when there are no elected representatives to raise them.

In the absence of a synergy between the people's voices and city governance structures, any number of well-intentioned investments and programmes will fall short of sustainable development. Hence, to truly contribute to the nation's vision of development, we need to give our cities a robust governance framework that supports both decision-making and implementation processes – UGI provides a roadmap for the same.

## 1.3. WHAT IS THE URBAN GOVERNANCE INDEX (UGI)?

The UGI is built on the foundations of four themes, which are divided into 13 sub-themes and consist of a total of 42 indicators. The thematic focus is primarily on the structural aspects of Urban Governance. The structural aspects entail the necessary decentralisation of powers from the State Government to City Government and the mechanism of accountability of the City Government towards citizens of the city. The source for the indicators ranges from primary data through interviews with stakeholders and secondary sources such as the state Municipal Acts and other relevant social documents. Data sources correspond to status as of July 2024. Experts were consulted in the preparation of this Index for guidance and validation at various stages during the preparation of this Index. The idea behind building the UGI is to understand the extent of decentralisation of the Urban Governance framework and the associated devolution of powers to the City Governments across states in the country. The corresponding gaps and necessary reforms to improve with respect to each state have been distinctly outlined through this Index report.

At the initial stages of preparing the index, there did exist a quandary with regard to; (i) criteria for selection of the cities from the state, given that we have 4000+ cities across the country, and (ii) given that a lot of states have multiple acts, how do we compute a composite score for a state. On this

note, it was decided that cities with best-in-class representation from each state shall be chosen. With this, the UGI entails a total of 31 cities across 28 states, 2 Union Territories and the NCT of Delhi. However, if monitoring the implementation of reforms for a particular state is necessary, the UGI can be modified or localised accordingly by choosing the best representative sample number of cities from that state.

UGI can be used by the states to evaluate their urban governance systems vis-à-vis other states, and in identifying the necessary reform actions that are to be taken for improvisation in the system. Stakeholders from civil society, academia, experts from the sector, the media, administrators, and more importantly, elected representatives can use the index as a base to monitor implementations and further can collaborate towards advocating for reform actions included in the UGI for their respective state.

### **States and Cities studied in Urban Governance Index 2024**

*Andhra Pradesh (Vijayawada), Arunachal Pradesh (Itanagar), Assam (Guwahati), Bihar (Patna), Chandigarh (Chandigarh), Chhattisgarh (Raipur), Delhi (Municipal Corporation of Delhi), Goa (Panaji), Gujarat (Ahmedabad), Haryana (Gurugram), Himachal Pradesh (Shimla), Jammu and Kashmir (Srinagar), Jharkhand (Ranchi), Karnataka (Bengaluru), Kerala (Thiruvananthapuram), Madhya Pradesh (Bhopal), Maharashtra (Mumbai), Manipur (Imphal), Meghalaya (Shillong), Mizoram (Aizawl), Nagaland (Kohima), Odisha (Bhubaneswar), Punjab (Amritsar), Rajasthan (Jaipur), Sikkim (Gangtok), Tamil Nadu (Chennai), Telangana (Hyderabad), Tripura (Agartala), Uttar Pradesh (Lucknow), Uttarakhand (Dehradun) and West Bengal (Kolkata).*

## 1.4. URBAN GOVERNANCE INDEX – THEMES & WEIGHTAGES

The UGI is built over four themes. These are as follows:

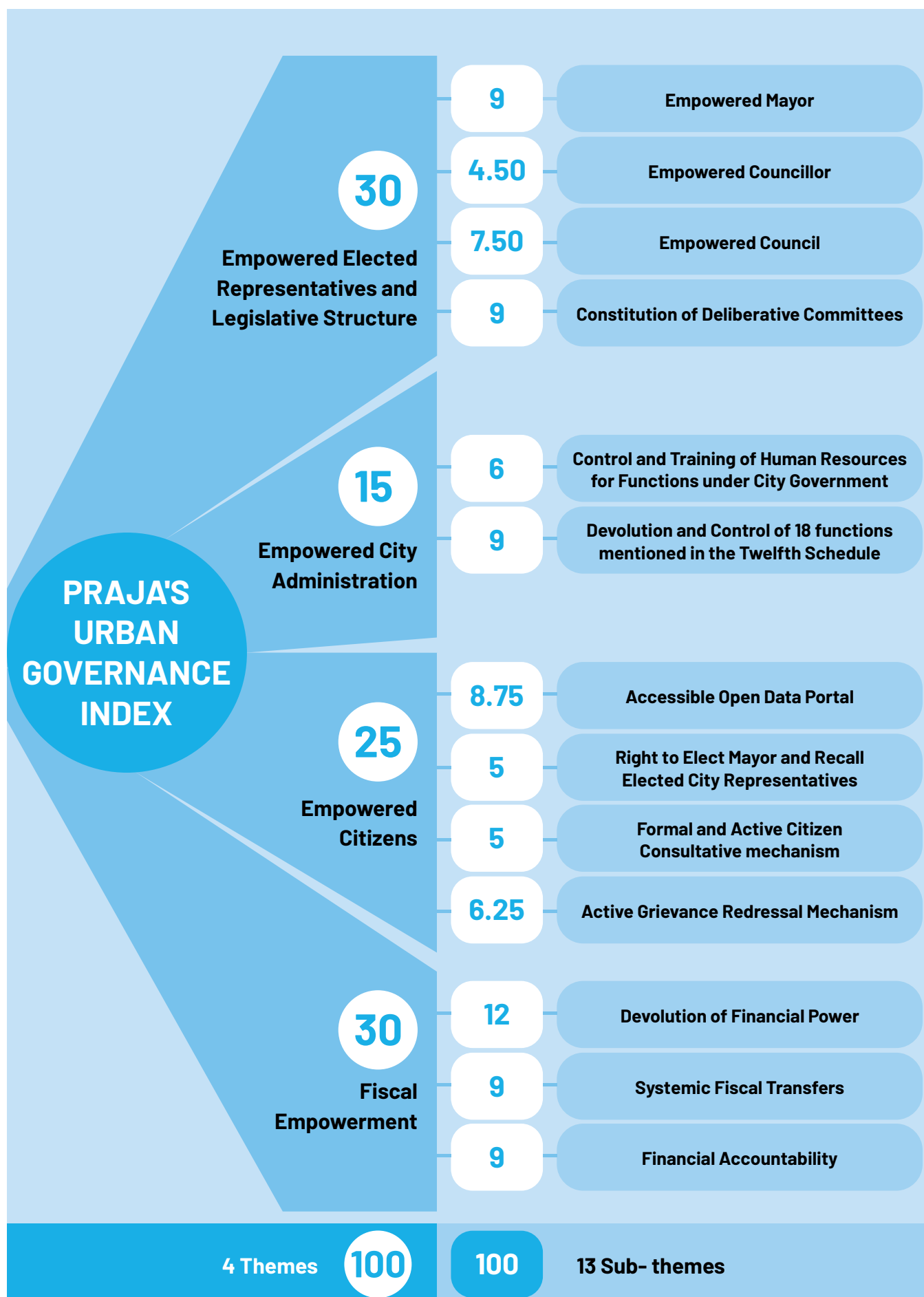
- i) Empowered City Elected Representatives and Legislative Structure
- ii) Empowered City Administration
- iii) Empowered Citizens
- iv) Fiscal Empowerment

These themes act as bedrock to achieving empowered urban governance. They are significant in enabling the functioning of democratic and empowered urban governance. These themes are further divided into 13 sub-themes and comprise a total of 42 indicators. The first theme, 'Empowered City Elected Representatives and Legislative Structure' is based on the premise that Elected Representatives (ERs) of the City Government i.e., the Mayor and Councillors, are elected by the citizens of the city, and hence, should ensure that the citizens' mandate is represented at the designated platforms and effort is put towards its implementation. For this to happen, the local ERs should be empowered to make decisions and undertake planning concerning the delivery of services and execution of projects. This also includes the necessary powers of empowered legislative structures such as the Council, the Mayor-In-Council, subject committees, etc., to facilitate and enable robust deliberations and decision-making within the City Government. Comprising all the above-mentioned descriptions, the theme of Empowered City Elected Representatives and Legislative Structure is divided into sub-themes: 'Empowered Mayor', 'Empowered Councillor', 'Empowered Council' and 'Constitution of Deliberative Committees'. The second theme, 'Empowered City Administration' entails independent control over human resource management and the 18 functions mentioned in the

Twelfth Schedule of the 74th CAA. To uphold the spirit of democratic empowerment and accountability, the city administration should also have control over the Smart City Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV) which plans and executes smart city projects in the city. The theme comprises the following subthemes: 'Control and Training of Human Resources for functions under City Government' and 'Devolution and Control of 18 functions mentioned in the Twelfth Schedule.'

The third theme, 'Empowered Citizens,' is based on the fact that citizens of the city, elect their ERs, who form the City Government, and also pay taxes and charges to the City Government for delivering efficient services in the city. Hence, it should be the right of the citizens to be aware of the functioning of the City Government through mechanisms that ensure transparency towards citizens. Citizens should also be entitled to participate, through a consultative process, in urban governance and should be empowered to hold their ERs accountable for their actions. The theme of Empowered Citizens is further detailed into the following sub-themes: Accessible Open Data Portal, Right to Elect and Recall Elected City Representatives, Formal and Active Citizen Consultative Mechanism and Active Grievance Redressal Mechanism. The fourth theme, 'Fiscal Empowerment' primarily involves the independent financial powers to raise financial resources, and the receipt of systematic and predictable rule-based fiscal transfers to enhance the financial resources of the City Government. Apart from the above, the efficiency of financial management should also go hand-in-hand to uphold the full-fledged fiscal empowerment of the City Government. This theme comprises the following sub-themes: 'Devolution of Financial Power', 'Systemic Fiscal Transfers', and 'Financial Accountability'.

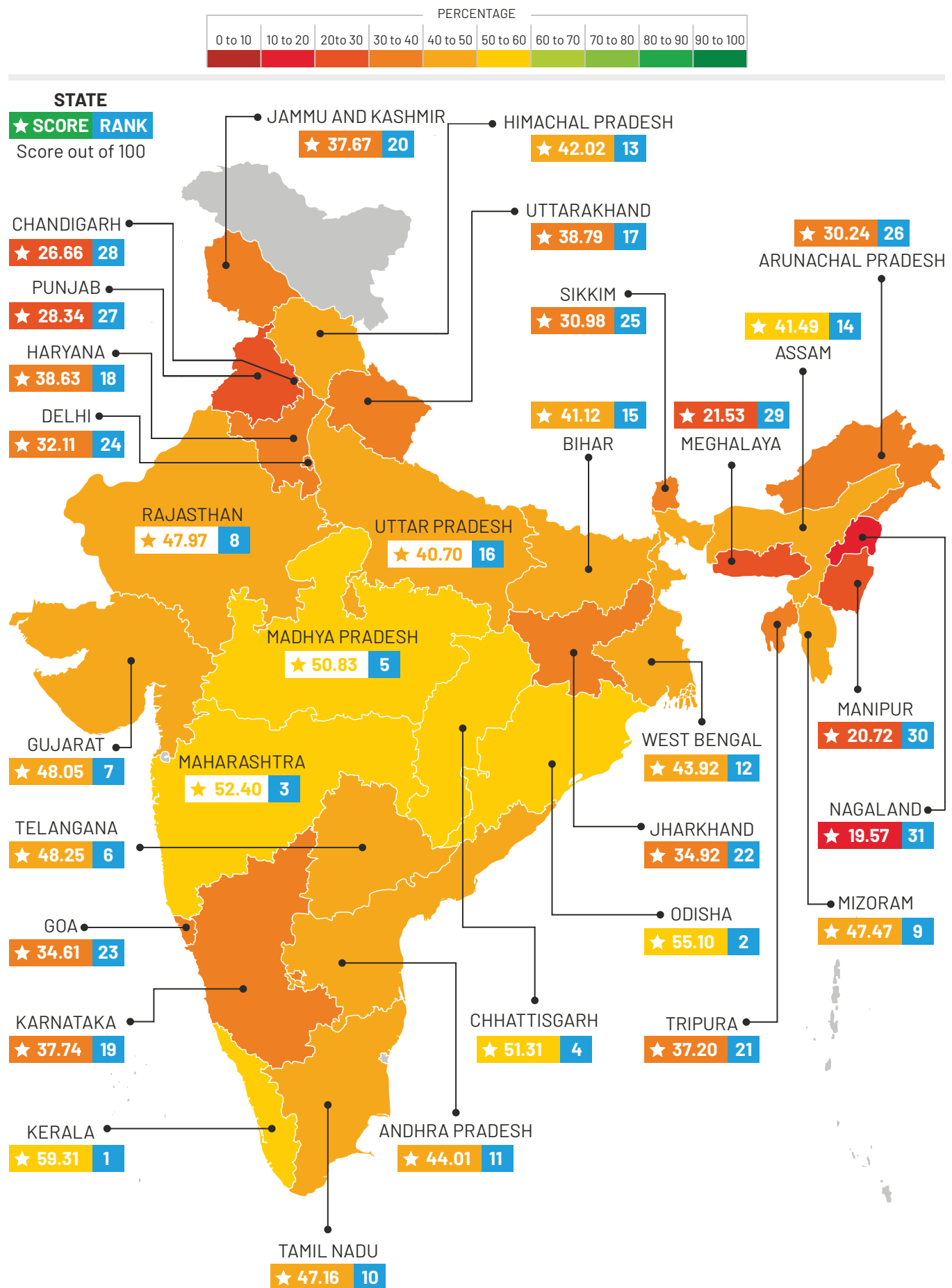

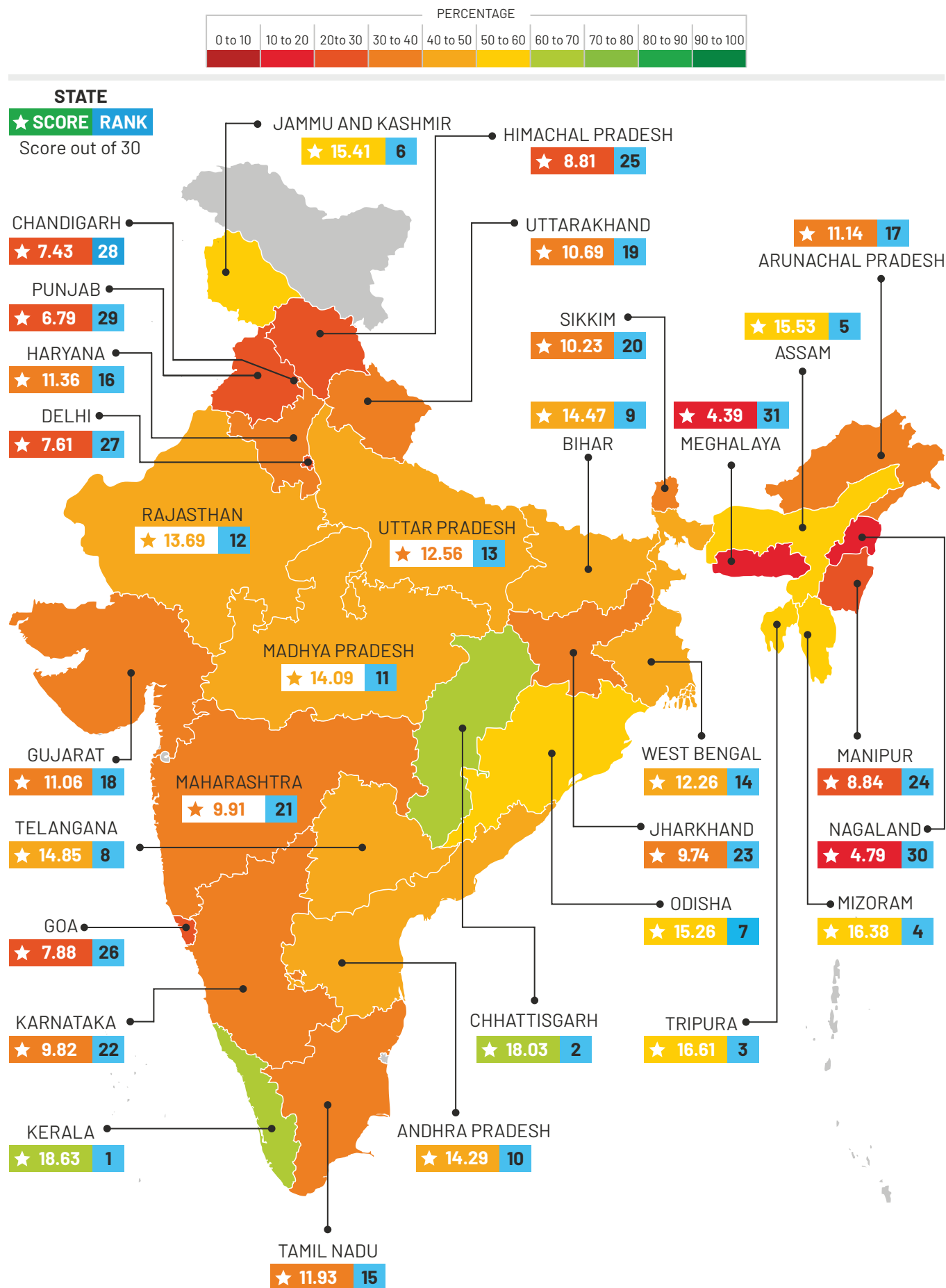

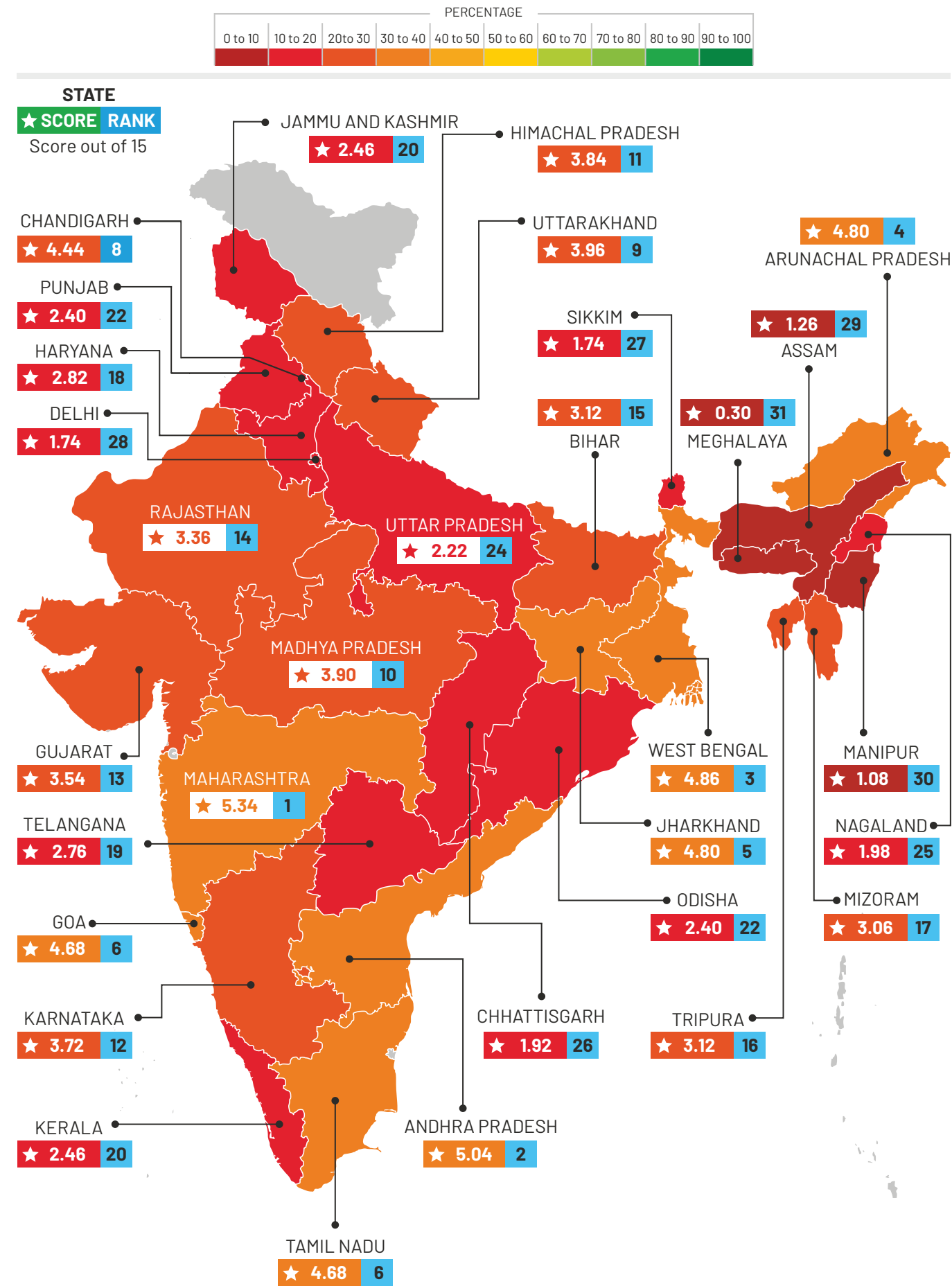

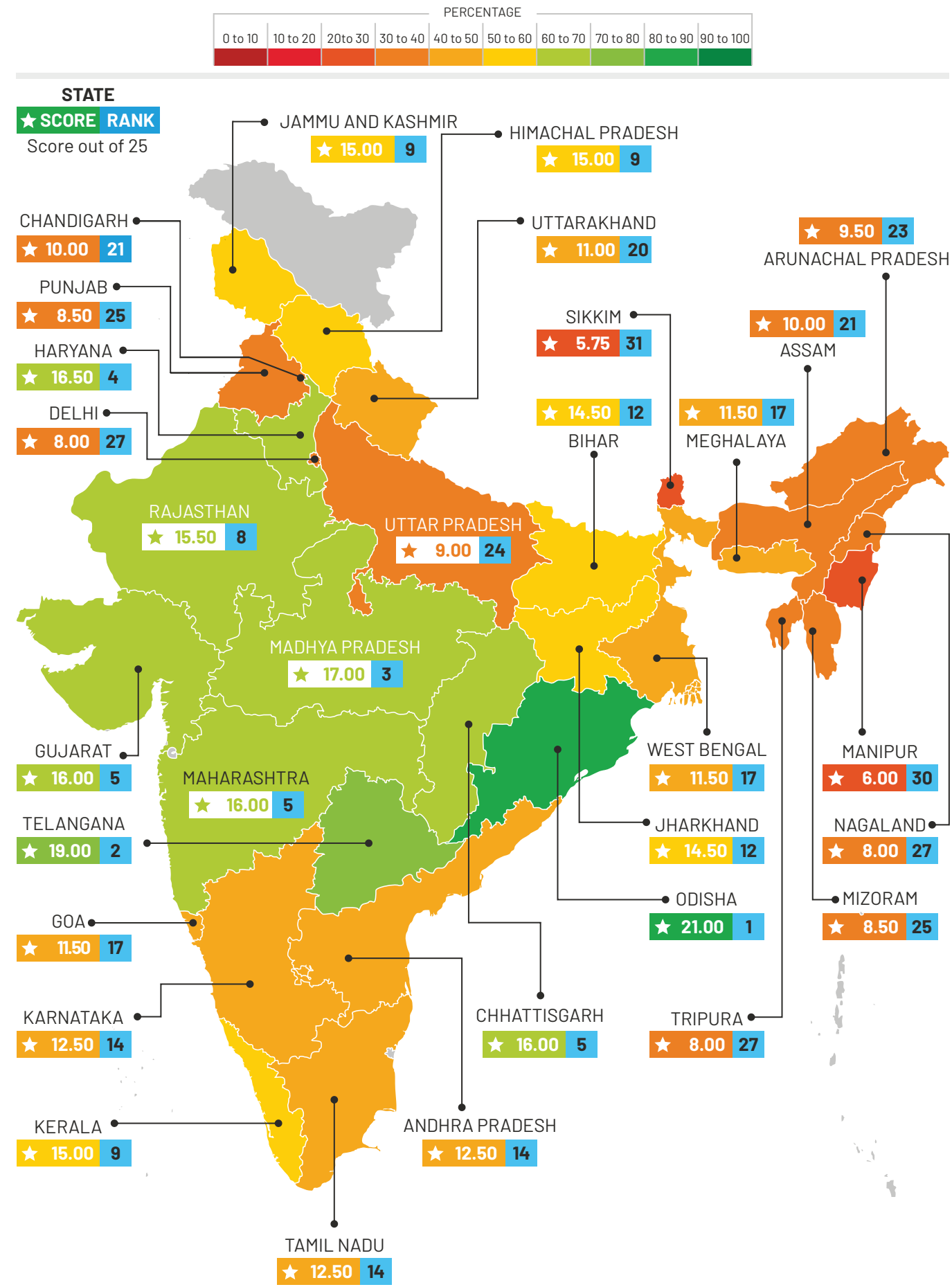

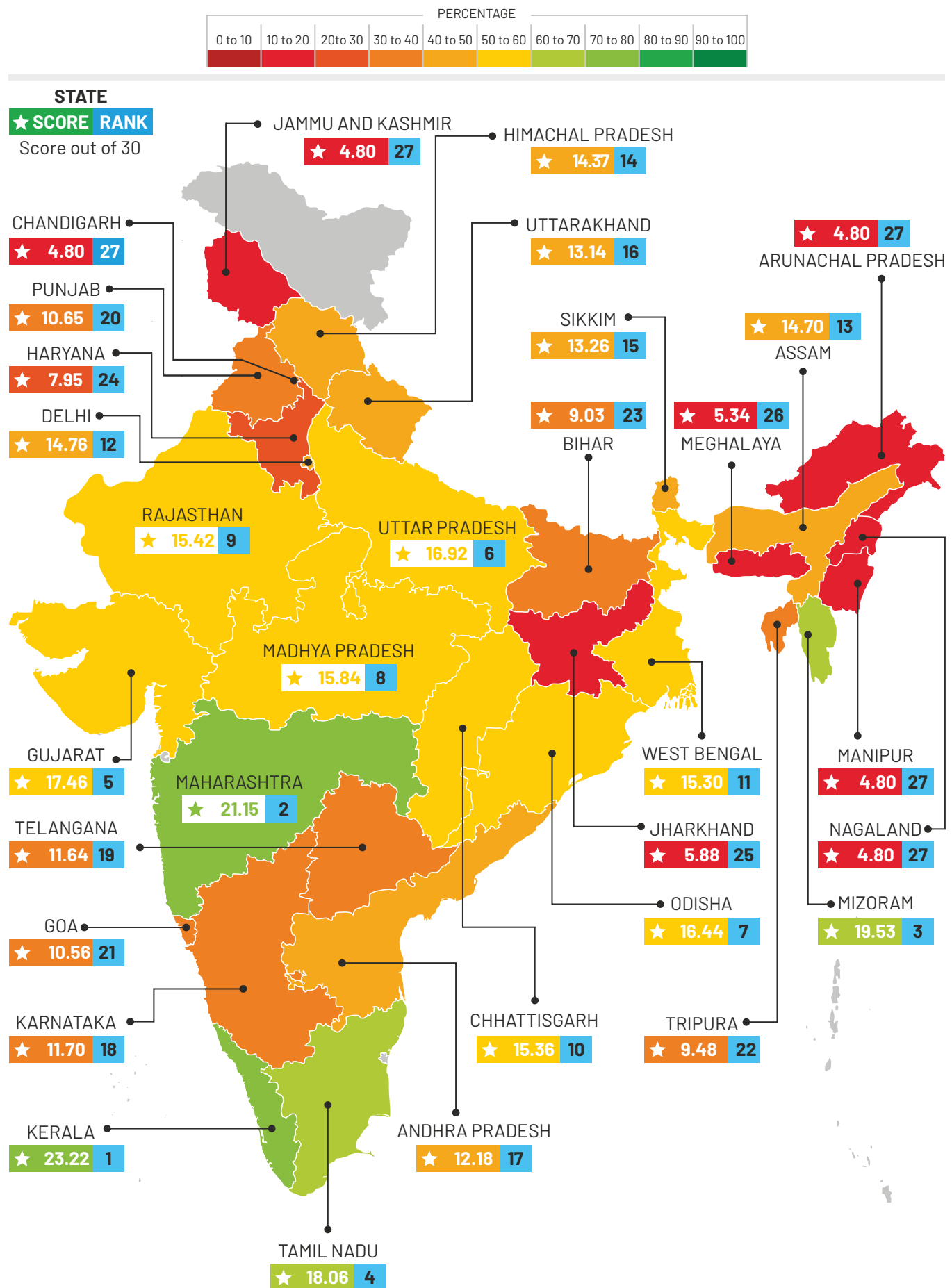

## 3.6. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Urban Governance Index (UGI) 2024 is the second edition of this metric, building upon UGI 2020. This study has comprehensively mapped the progress, developments, and policy changes undertaken by state and city governments across 42 UGI indicators. The average score for 28 states, 2 Union Territories, and the National Capital Territory of Delhi stands at 39.70%. Cities have increasingly adopted technology to enhance their websites, which now serve as accessible Open Data Portals, offering transparency into municipal operations. Despite these advancements, a significant concern is the high vacancy rate in sanctioned posts within Municipal Corporations. Additionally, 18 functions devolved to city governments under the 12th Schedule of the Constitution are increasingly managed by multiple agencies, reducing the independent authority of city governments. The persistent issue of a weak mayoral system across many states continues to constrain the executive role of city leadership.

Regarding policy reforms, several state and city governments have introduced significant changes. Tamil Nadu has established the Tamil Nadu Urban Local Bodies Rule 2023, which complements the state's Municipal Act and provides a structured framework for municipal operations. Karnataka has enacted a new Municipal Act specifically for Bengaluru, creating a distinct governance model for the city. In Itanagar, the Mayor's tenure is now co-terminus with the city government, aligning leadership with governance. Bihar has implemented direct elections for Mayors, enhancing citizen participation in selecting city leadership. Conversely, Assam has amended its Act to remove provisions for Ward Committees and Area Sabha, which may reduce community involvement in local governance.

Key observations for the four thematic areas are summarised as follows:



### Empowering Elected Representatives and Legislative Structures:

1. The average score for 31 cities is 39.19%.
2. Five states (Assam, Chhattisgarh, Madhya Pradesh, Tripura, and West Bengal) have Mayor-in-Council system as per their State Municipal Act.
3. Kerala is the only state to give the Mayor the authority to write an 'Annual Confidential Report' of the Commissioner.
4. Shimla is the only Municipal Corporation that facilitates a digital mechanism for councillors to submit their questions.
5. In seven cities (Chandigarh, Delhi, Panaji, Ahmedabad, Shimla, Bengaluru & Mumbai) the post of the Mayor is not co-terminus with the city government.
6. Only four states (Chhattisgarh, Kerala, Mizoram, and Odisha) mandate that every councillor should be part of at least one deliberative committee.
7. No state has provisions for regular training for councillors.
8. 10 cities (Panaji, Shimla, Ranchi, Imphal, Shillong, Kohima, Amritsar, Gangtok, Dehradun, and Kolkata) do not have a procedure to conduct business rules.
9. Municipal Acts of three states (Assam, Meghalaya and Nagaland) do not have provisions to constitute zonal/ward committees.
10. Only four states and one union territory (Gujarat, Haryana, Karnataka, Maharashtra and Jammu and Kashmir) have made provision for all committees (including councils) to hold meetings at least once a month in their Municipal Acts.



### Empowered City Administration

1. The average score for 31 cities is 21.02%
2. City Administrations of only three states (Goa, Uttar Pradesh, and Uttarakhand) have sanctioning authority for recruitment.
3. Three states (Jharkhand, Mizoram, and Tripura) have made provisions for the training of city administration in the Municipal Act.
4. No state has devolved all 18 functions listed in the 12th Schedule of the Constitution to city governments. In Mumbai, 11 functions are under the independent control of the city, the highest among all states, while in three states (Meghalaya, Uttar Pradesh, and Uttarakhand) just one function is under the independent control of city governments.



### Empowered Citizens

1. The average score for 31 cities is 49.71%
2. All 31 cities have a functional website.
3. Seven states (Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Haryana, Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, and Uttarakhand) conduct direct elections for the Mayor.
4. No state has a provision giving the citizens the right to recall their councillors.
5. Only three cities (Chandigarh, Srinagar, and Bhubaneswar) have enabled citizens to communicate their suggestions (needs and wants) through their websites.



### Fiscal Empowerment

1. The average score for 31 cities is 41.22%
2. Nine State Governments and one Union Territory (Delhi, Gujarat, Karnataka, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Mizoram, Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, and West Bengal) have given independent authority to introduce new taxes/charges in their Municipal Acts as well as the authority to revise tax rates/charges.
3. 16 cities (Itanagar, Patna, Chandigarh, Raipur, Gurugram, Shimla, Srinagar, Ranchi, Bengaluru, Imphal, Kohima, Bhubaneswar, Amritsar, Jaipur, Gangtok and Chennai) out of 31 do not have an independent authority to approve the budget according to the State Municipal Act.
4. No city governments receive a direct percentage share of GST
5. 13 State Municipal Acts (Andhra Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Goa, Gujarat, Jharkhand, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Mizoram, Punjab, Tamil Nadu, Telangana and West Bengal) make it mandatory to publish the budget and accounts in the public domain.
6. Meghalaya is the only state where the Municipal Act does not make provision for conducting an external audit.



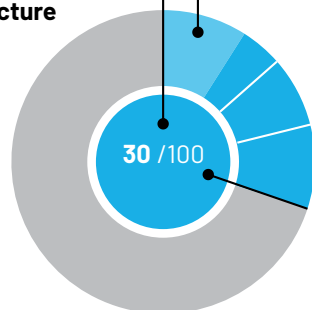

## INDICATOR – DIRECTIVE PRINCIPLES

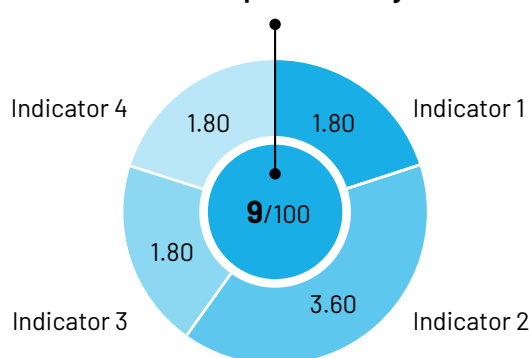
As mentioned earlier, the themes of the Urban Governance Index (UGI) are divided into sub-themes, and these sub-themes are further broken down into set of indicators. The chapter focuses on explaining the directive principle behind each of these indicators included in the UGI. The principles will give brief explanation on 'what does the indicator mean exactly?' and conclude with the explanation on 'how is the Indicator Score calculated for the indicator?'. The weightage and final score of the indicators are also mentioned for each indicator. Each indicator holds a weightage under the respective sub-theme it falls under. The Indicator Score is the maximum score assigned for each indicator. Finally, the source of each indicator has also been mentioned.

### Is the post of Mayor co-terminus with the term of City Government?

#### Directive Principle

The Office of the Mayor needs to be coterminous with the term of the City Government as this allows for experience gathering, execution of envisioned projects and ultimately fulfilment of citizens' mandate. Article 243U of the Constitution (Seventy-fourth Amendment) Act, 1992 mandates the duration of the City Government to be five years from the date of appointment for its first meeting. When the term of the Mayor is co-terminus with the term of the City Government, it allows for synchronised planning, execution and decision making for the office of the Mayor.

Therefore, as per the State Municipal Act, if the Mayor's term is coterminous with the term of the City Government, it will result to maximum Indicator Score as mentioned.

### Does the Mayor hold executive authority over the Commissioner?

**Sub-Indicator 2.1:** Does the Mayor hold authority to write Annual Confidential Report (ACR) of the Commissioner?

#### Directive Principle

As the head of the City Government, the Mayor needs to hold executive authority over the Commissioner who needs to be fully accountable to the Mayor, similar to the functioning of Central and State Governments. This can be effectively done if the Mayor has the authority to write the ACR of the Commissioner.

**Sub-Indicator 2.2:** Does the Mayor hold independent an authority to conduct appraisals (increment, promotion, suspension, demotion) of the Commissioner based on ACR?

#### Directive Principle

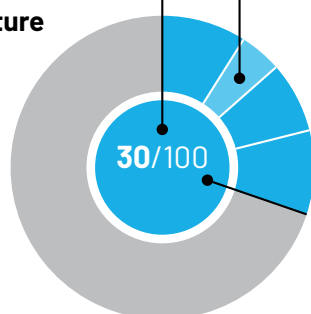
While Mayor holding the authority to write an ACR of the Commissioner is a key mechanism to ensure accountability of the administration, there is also need for authority to take actions based on the review of the ACR filed by the Mayor. If actions are not taken in accordance with the performance appraisal, then the mechanism holds no significance.

Likewise, there should be a mechanism which allows the Mayor to determine appointment and termination of the Commissioner, provided that the decision is ratified in the council (or house or board) of the City Government for approval.</p> <p>Cities where the State Municipal Act has provisions for the Mayor to hold executive authority over the Commissioner i.e., (i) authority to write the ACR of the Commissioner; (ii) holding of independent authority to conduct appraisals (increment, promotion, suspension, demotion) of Commissioner based on ACR and (iii) authority to appoint and terminate the Commissioner, subject to ratification of council, are given maximum Indicator Score as mentioned.</p>

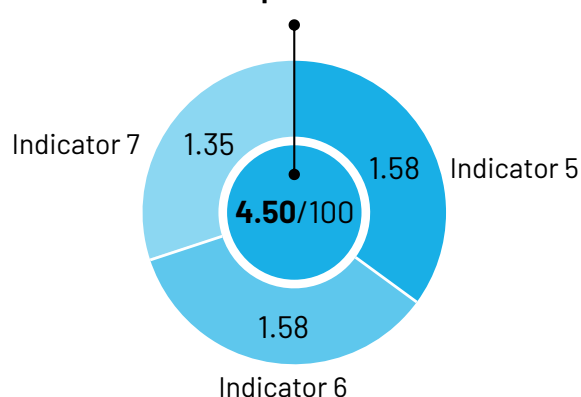

The committee should be headed by the Mayor and various Standing/Subject committee heads should be the members of the apex body.</p> <p>Hence, as per the State Municipal Act, if the Mayor is the chairperson of such apex committees like Mayor in Council (MIC)/Steering committee, it will result to maximum Indicator Score as mentioned.</p>

Hence, it is crucial that every Councillor be entitled to participate in at least one committee (Standing/ Subject) that has been constituted by the Council.

Therefore, as per the State Municipal Act, if every Councillor is a member of at least one Standing/ Subject committee (except Council, Zonal, Ward/Wards committee), it will result to maximum Indicator Score as mentioned.

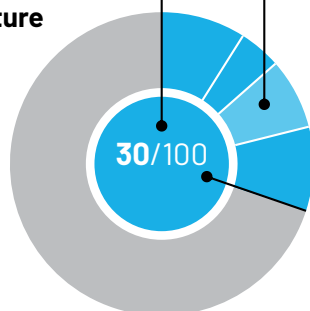

Hence, if the State Municipal Act has provisions for regular trainings to be conducted for Councillors, it will result to maximum Indicator Score as mentioned.

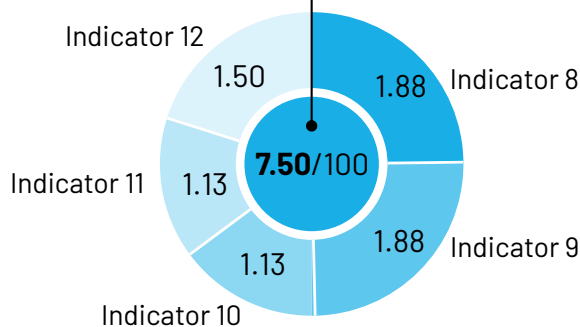

To do this effectively, the basic needs of the Councillor needs to be taken care of. In account of this, it would be prudent to give them fixed monthly salaries. In line with the same, the Mayor, committee chairpersons and Councillors should receive salary and allowances commensurate to the post. In this indicator, we have considered remuneration and honorarium as a salary.</p>		
<b>Sub-Indicator 7.2:</b> Is the fixed salary of Councillors at par or more than that of the Commissioner?		
<b>Directive Principle</b> <p>The Commissioner should report to the Councillors as a whole. Therefore, the fixed salary that the Councillor receives should be at par or more than that of the Commissioner.</p>

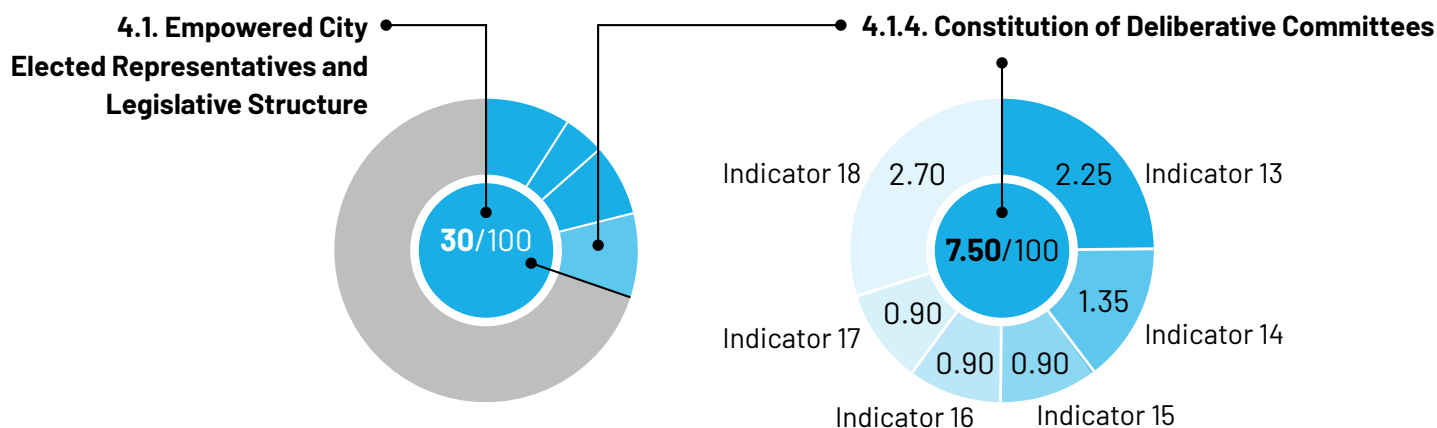

Article 243ZD and 243ZE of the Constitution (Seventy-fourth Amendment) Act, 1992 mandates the constitution of District Planning Committees (DPC) in all districts across states and Metropolitan Planning Committees (MPC) in all metropolitan areas across states respectively. The provisions were made to enable preparation of draft development plan by discussing subjects of common interest and resource planning between the municipalities and panchayats in the respective district or metropolitan area accordingly.

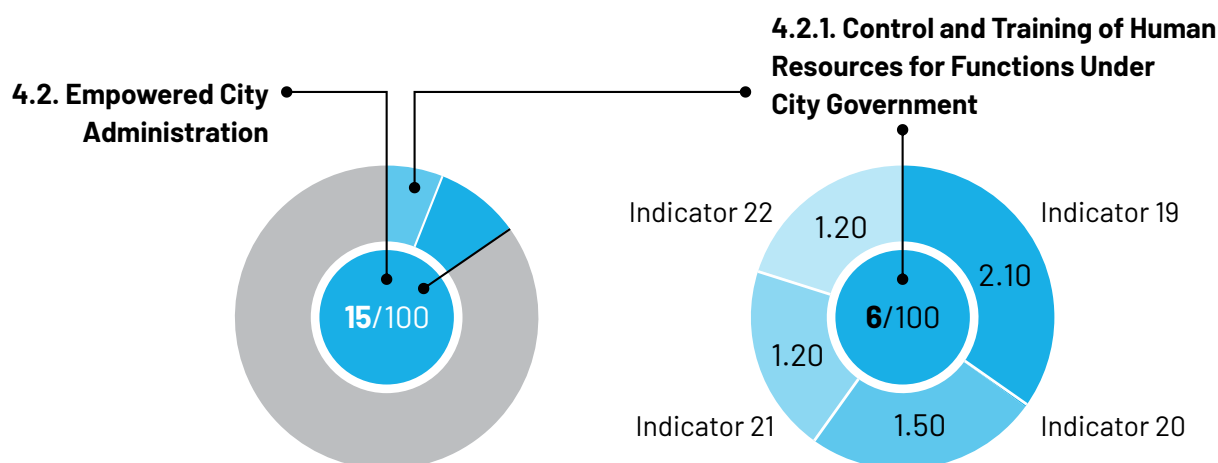
The constitutional mandate specifies that the DPC should consist of four-fifth representation of elected representatives with respect to the proportion of municipalities and panchayats in the district. Likewise, the same should be followed in the case of the MPC.

It is crucial that the head of this committee is an elected representative, who should be elected from amongst the members. It is also critical for ERs to participate and drive the planning process, thereby ensuring that citizen's interests are represented.

Hence, states where the District Planning Committee (DPC)/Metropolitan Planning Committee (MPC) have 80% representation of ERs and the Chairperson is an ER as per the State Town Planning Act/District Panchayat Act/Panchayati Raj Act, are given maximum Indicator Score as mentioned.

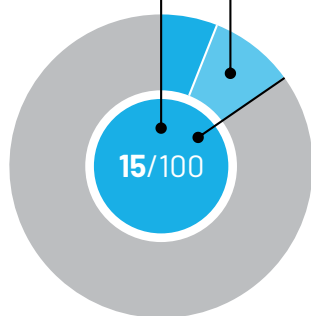

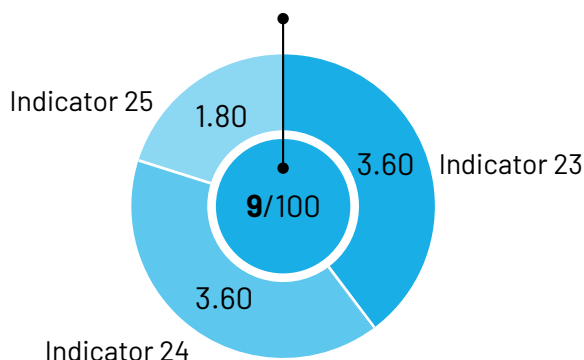

However, it has been more than 25 years since the Constitutional amendment came into force, the 18 functions have not been completely transferred to the City Governments. The listed functions are of high importance and should be delivered through performing decentralised delivery of services. Therefore, the State Governments need to ensure that devolution of the listed functions to City Governments is done.

Similarly, any parastatal body or an Special Purpose Vehicle (SPVs) such as the Smart City, which operates within the jurisdiction of the City Government which delivers services and projects, needs to function under the control of City Government for better coordination and execution of projects in the spirit of local self-governance. Hence, it is prudent to have the Smart City SPV which currently executes smart city projects in many of the cities to be brought under the control of the City Government. Cities that are not part of the Smart City Mission have not been assessed under the Indicator for 'Independent control of Smart City SPV under city administration'.

Hence, in cities where all the 18 functions mentioned in Twelfth Schedule and smart city SPV are under independent control of city administration, it will result to maximum Indicator Score as mentioned.

Hence, the City Governments with independent control over highest number of functions out of the 18 functions relatively (higher the better), are given maximum Indicator Score as mentioned.

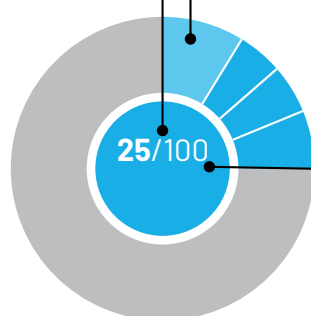

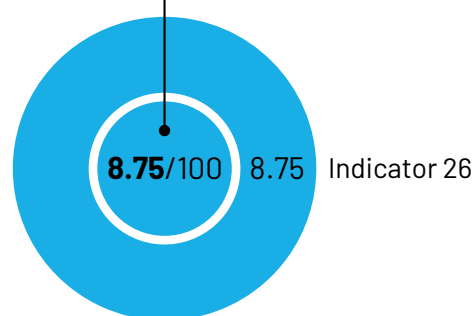

The City Governments serve the urban citizens and hence, citizens have the right to know how their City Government is performing. This disclosure of information will help civil society and academia to identify gaps and provide feedback. With regard to this, open data portals need to be set up by every City Government that functions as a platform to access datasets, documents, services, tools and applications. This indicator is further divided into 11 sub-indicators, each assessing different aspects of the open data portal. Two of which are covered further in indicators 29 (availability of minutes of the general body & committees on the website) & 41.3 (availability of last 3 years accounts on the website) and hence are not mentioned here. Scores are awarded based on the fulfillment of these sub-indicators by the City Government.

##### Sub-Indicator 26.1: Does the Municipal Corporation have a desktop version of their website?

##### Directive Principle

Accessibility and transparency of municipal data in the digital age should be facilitated by a desktop version of the Municipal Corporation website. The website should be user-friendly, regularly updated, and provide comprehensive details on the corporation's initiatives and governance. Therefore, if the city government has a functional desktop version website, the maximum sub-indicator Score is given.

##### Sub-Indicator 26.2: Does the Municipal Corporation have a mobile version of their website?

##### Directive Principle

Indian citizens currently have a significant access to mobile devices including smart phones. A mobile responsive website ensures ease of access to citizens. Hence, if the city government has a mobile responsive website, full sub-indicator score is achieved.

##### Sub-Indicator 26.3: Are details of the city government's annual programmes, projects or budget speech available online?

##### Directive Principle

Access to the details of city government's annual programmes and projects through annual report or budget speech informs citizens about upcoming projects and resource allocation. This fosters greater public trust and engagement in municipal governance. Full sub-indicator score is allotted if these details are available on the city government website.

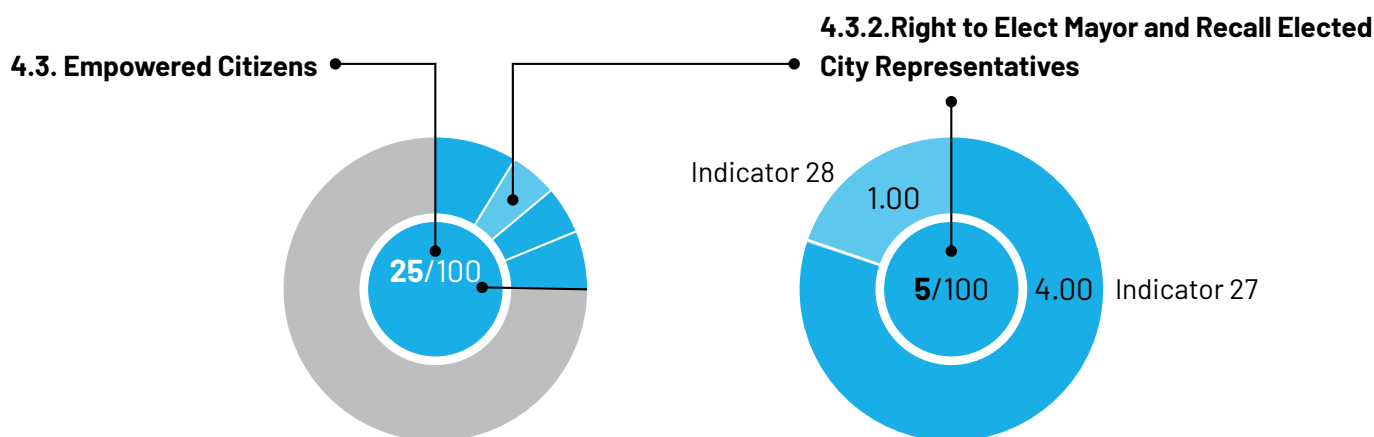

##### Directive Principle

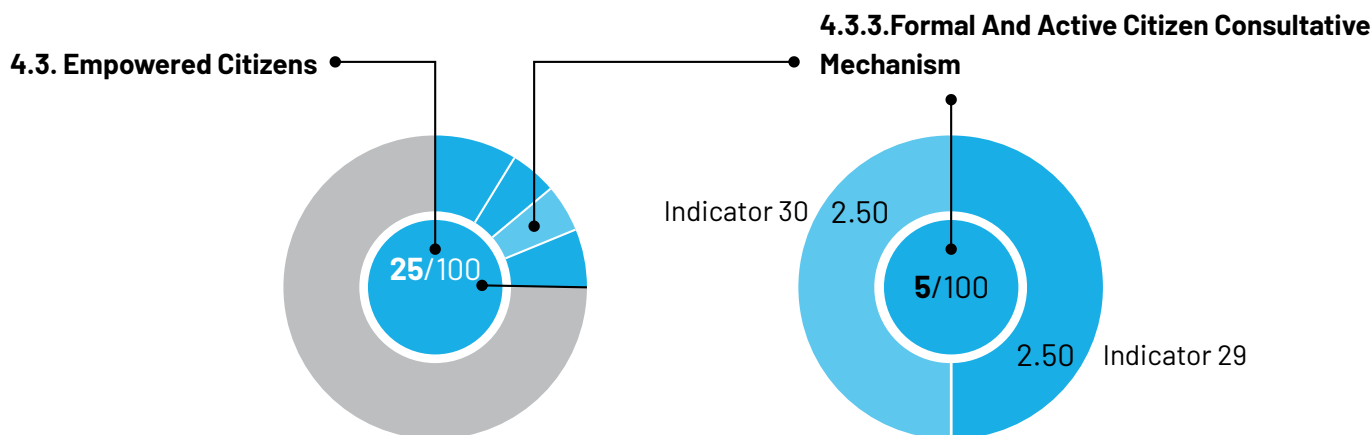

<b>Directive Principle</b> The citizen's charter outlines the services provided by various departments of the city government. If the city government website has department specific information or citizen's charter published online, full sub-indicator score is allotted.		
<b>Sub-Indicator 26.8:</b> Is there an online mechanism for citizens to provide suggestions for their ward/city?		
<b>Directive Principle</b> A digital platform that empowers citizens to express their needs and wants in the municipal ward or city enables active citizen participation ensuring a citizen-centric approach when planning for service delivery and infrastructure provisions. Cities which have a dedicated functionality on their portal for suggestions different from their grievance redressal functionality receive full sub-indicator score here.		
<b>Sub-Indicator 26.9:</b> Are details of national, state & city government policies accessible on the Website?		
<b>Directive Principle</b> Providing details about union, state, and city government schemes and welfare policies helps citizens understand the benefits available to them and the process for accessing them. Cities that have made information on local government schemes, as well as state and union government programs such as PMAY, DAY-NULM and various housing or health schemes readily accessible have been awarded full sub-indicator score here.

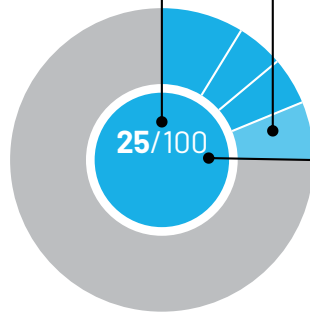

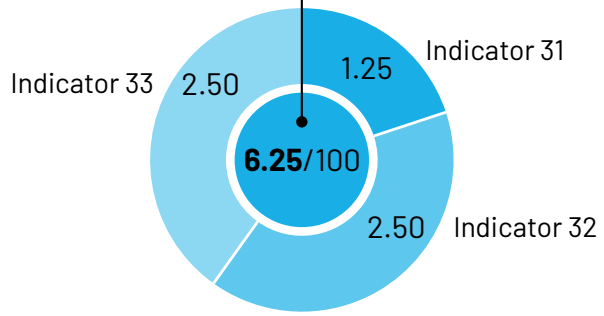

##### Directive Principle

The digitalised Grievance Redressal Mechanism (GRM) needs to be a centralised system with an ability to take in grievances registered through multiple modes. The modes can be a telephone number, mobile application, in-person office/kiosks/ ward/zonal office visit by citizens, online system such as through website/portal etc. It should be ensured that there is only a single input system (for e.g., single phone number, single mobile application, single website page etc.).

Hence, cities where the GRM have centralised mechanisms to process complaints registered through multiple modes, where each mode has singular input option (e.g., one phone number, one mobile app), are given maximum Indicator Score as mentioned.

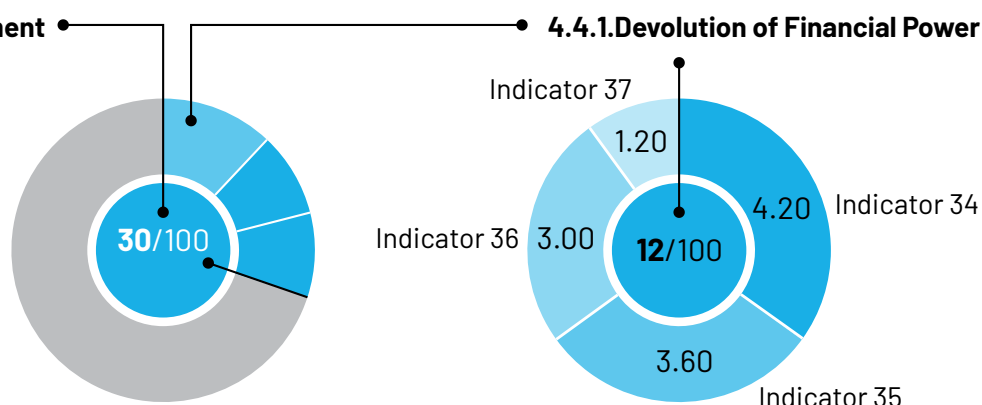

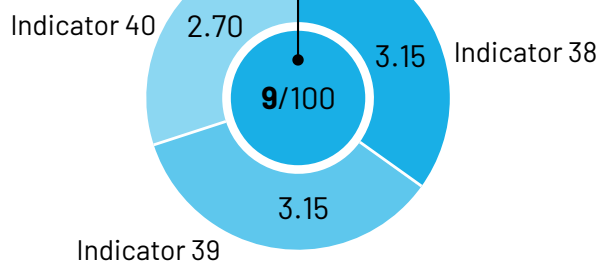
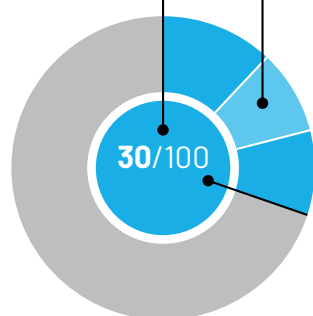

As per Article 243Y of the Constitution (Seventy-fourth Amendment) Act, 1992, States should constitute State Finance Commission (SFC) every five years in order to conduct the review of financial status of Local Governments in the state and furnish a SFC report with recommendations. Hence, in this context, since the Constitution (Seventy-fourth Amendment) Act, 1992 came into force, the latest SFC to be constituted in each state is supposed to be the 6th SFC. Therefore, through this indicator, we have looked at whether the 6th SFC reports have been published by the States on the respective State Finance Commission website.

Here, we have made exceptions to States that were formed post the year 1992. The calculations for constitution and publishing of the SFC report for the states have been taken from the respective date of formation of those states.

Therefore, states where the SFC has published the 6th SFC report on an official website, are given maximum Indicator Score as mentioned.

The GST has subsumed taxes levied by the State, but it has made a provision of sharing of taxes between the Centre and the State. The subsumed list of taxes also includes local taxes, however, there is no 'direct sharing' of taxes allotted for the City Governments. There are only indirect funds coming through schemes and programmes. City Government should also be entitled to receive a direct regular share of the GST revenue collection by the Central Government similar to that of State Government receiving a direct share (State GST and Integrated GST). This direct share to City Governments must be done via mechanisms such as escrow account system. This can be mandated by both the Centre and the State for allocation of direct share of GST to City Governments.

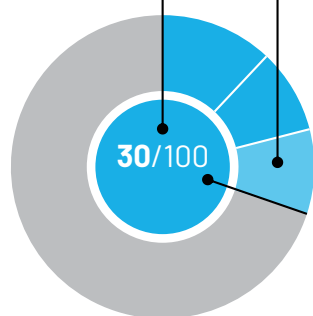

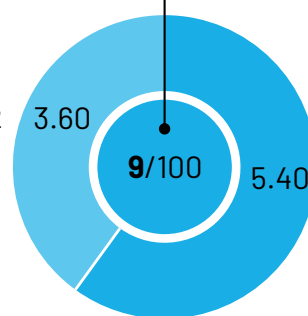

On similar lines, as the City Government also runs on public money, there should be accountability through established checks and balances. Therefore, the accounts of the City Governments should also be audited either by the State Government or by an independent agency of the City Government.

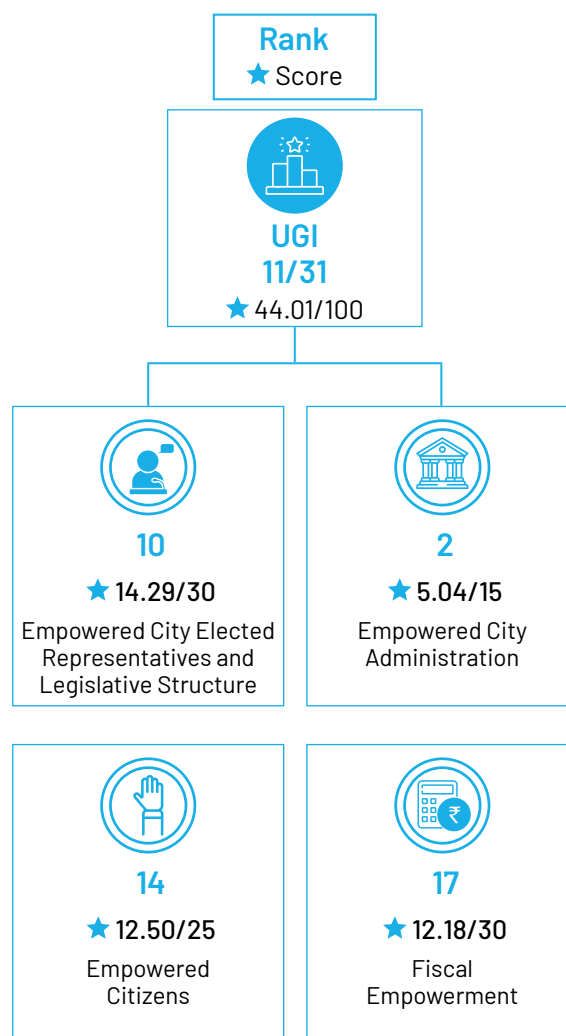

## Andhra Pradesh

Andhra Pradesh has four Acts for constitution of City Governments namely Andhra Pradesh Municipal Corporations Act, 1994; Vijayawada Municipal Corporation Act, 1981; Vishakhapatnam Municipal Corporation Act, 1979 and Andhra Pradesh Municipalities Act, 1965. Vijayawada Municipal Corporation has been considered for the purpose of Urban Governance Index. Vijayawada Municipal Corporation Act, 1981, Section 7 states that 'all provision of the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation, 1955 (GHMCA, 1955) shall apply mutatis mutandis to the Corporation. Therefore, GHMCA, 1955 will be referred for the sections.



### Key Observations

- To improve its urban governance structure, the state needs to grant the Mayor executive authority over the Commissioner, ensure commensurate salary and allowances for Councillors, and provide the council with the authority to pass a no-confidence motion against the Mayor.
- Although the city government has access to market borrowings, it does not have the authority to include new taxes or revise existing ones.
- In the Fiscal Empowerment theme it has secured 17th rank (Score 12.18/30). The state needs to empower the City Governments financially by devolving financial power and ensuring systemic fiscal transfers.

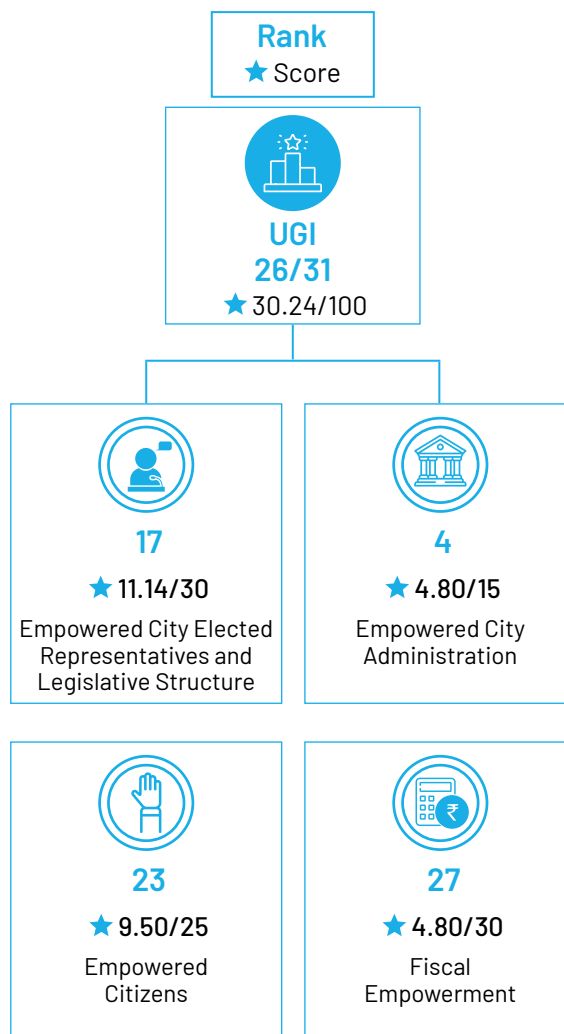

## Arunachal Pradesh

Arunachal Pradesh has two Acts for constitution of City Governments namely The Arunachal Pradesh Municipal Corporation Act, 2019 and The Arunachal Pradesh Municipal Act, 2007. Itanagar Municipal Corporation has been considered for the purpose of Urban Governance Index.



### Key Observations

- The state needs to empower its Mayor with executive authority over commissioner. There should be a provision for each Councillor to be part of at least one deliberative committee, and Councillors should receive training, commensurate salaries, and office allowances.
- According to The Arunachal Pradesh Municipal Corporation (Amendment) Act, 2021, the mayor's term has been extended from 2.5 years to 5 years, aligning it with the term of the corporation.
- Due to a relatively low scores in Empowered City Elected Representatives and Legislative Structure (11.14/30) and Fiscal Empowerment (4.80/30), the state has received overall 26th rank making Arunachal Pradesh one of the lowest performing state.
- The State Municipal Act should make it mandatory for the City Government to publish its budget and accounts.
- The City Governments should update its website periodically with budget & account documents, include a grievance redressal portal and ensure online accessibility to municipal services.

### Reasons for changes in Score and Rank between UGI 2020 to 2024

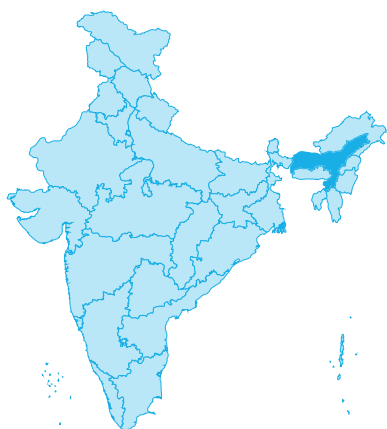

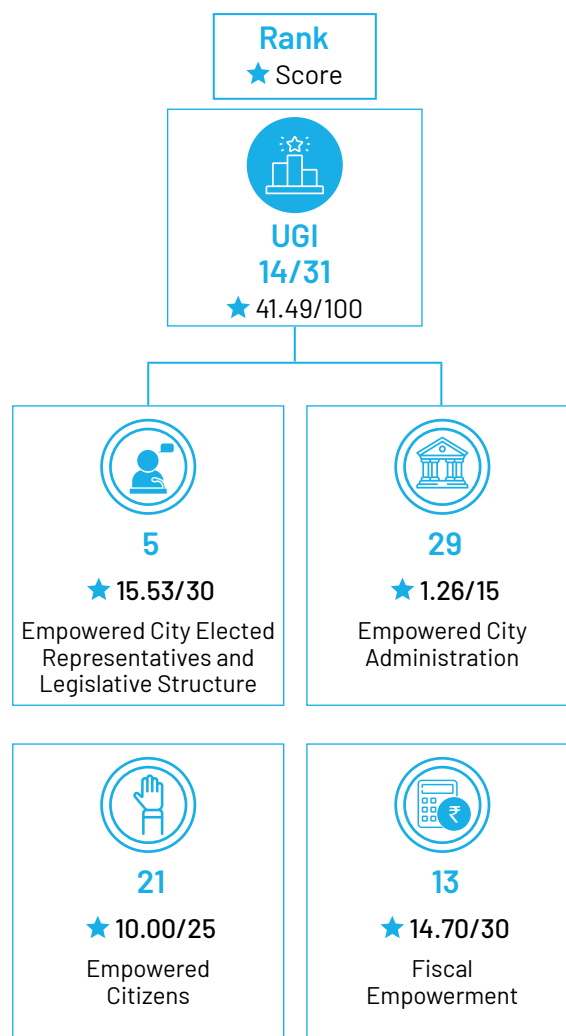

## Assam

Assam has two Acts for constitution of city governments namely The Guwahati Municipal Corporation Act, 1971 and Assam Municipal Act, 1956. Guwahati Municipal Corporation has been considered for the purpose of Urban Governance Index.



### Key Observations

- To improve the urban governance structure in Assam, the state needs to focus more on the theme of Empowered City Administration by devolving sanctioning authority, ensuring regular training for officials, and devolving functions to the City Government.
- As per Guwahati Municipal Corporation Election (Amendment) Act, 2021 and its Amendment in the year 2022 the provision for constitution of the Area Sabhas and Ward Committee of the Corporation was eliminated under section 20A.
- The State Act does not have provision for conducting elections before the council is dissolved, which is very crucial for an empowered council.
- The City Government in Assam also needs to establish open data portal and city government's active grievance redressal mechanism with centralised system where citizens can close the complaints.

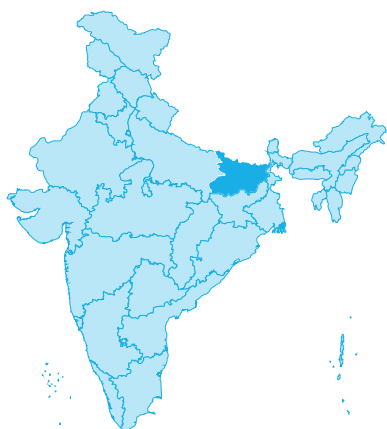

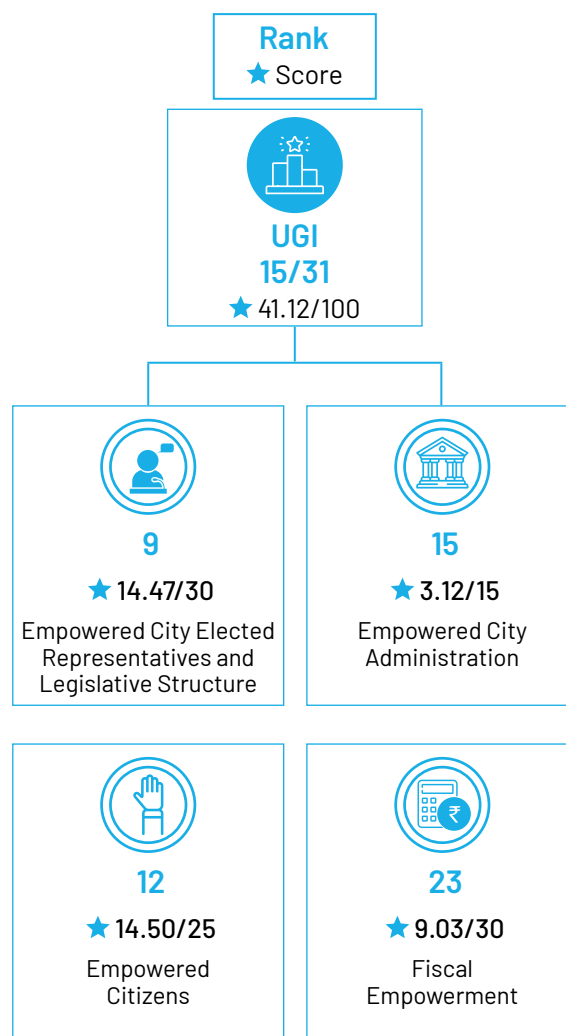

### Key Observations

- The Bihar State Municipal Act has provision for a robust deliberative committee structure; however, the committees have not been formed in practice, and the Act does not mandate that committees meet at least once a month.
- The council also should be given authority to frame rules, regulations and byelaws independently.
- The city administration of Bihar should be empowered by giving sanctioning authority for recruitment and ensuring regular training of the employees.
- Mode of election of the Mayor has changed from an indirect election to direct election.
- As per the State Municipal Act, the Patna Municipal Corporation (PMC) reserves 33 percent of seats for female candidates, currently PMC has 60 percent female councillors.

### Key Observations

- The state ranked in the top 5 in the themes of Empowered City Elected Representatives and Legislative Structure and Empowered Citizens but ranked 26th for Empowered City Administration.
- Chhattisgarh has scored the most in the Empowered Mayor (5.40/9.00) and Empowered Councillor (Score 1.98/4.50) sub-themes with a robust Deliberative Committee. The Mayor is the chairperson of the Mayor in Council (MIC) and also has the independent authority to nominate the members of the MIC.
- To improve the urban governance structure further, the city administration should have sanctioning authority for recruitments, less vacancy rate in the city administration, provision for training of officials and all 18 functions listed under the 12th Schedule of 74th Constitutional Amendment Act devolved to the city government.
- The council also should be given authority to frame rules, regulations and byelaws independently and citizens should have right to recall the Councillors.
- City administrations in Chhattisgarh should be empowered by granting them the authority to approve recruitment and ensuring that employees receive regular training.

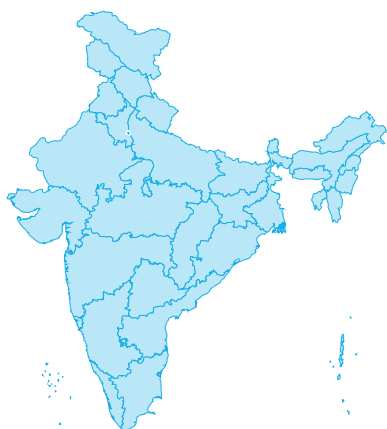

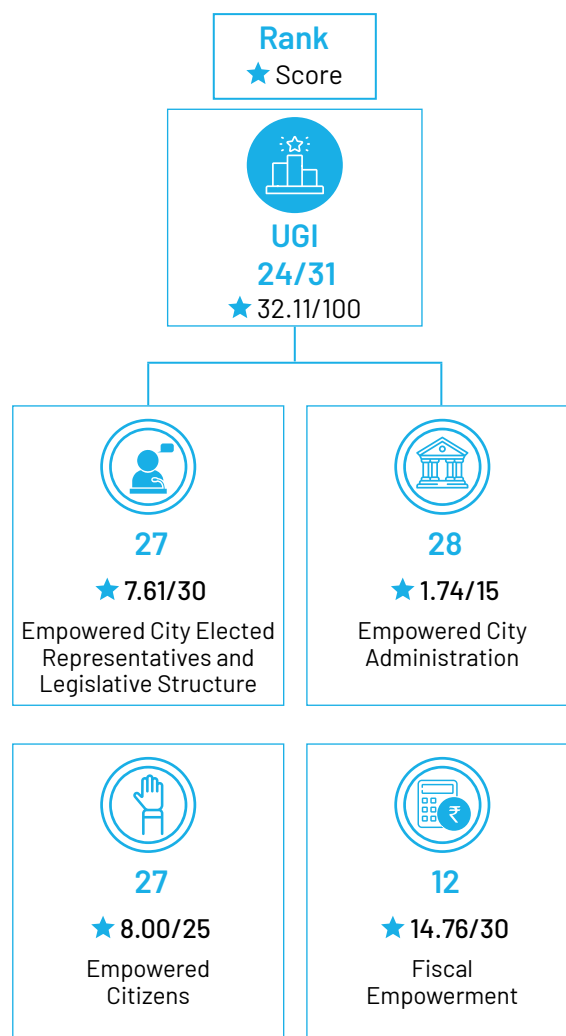

## Delhi

Delhi has The Delhi Municipal Corporation Act, 1957 for constitution of city governments. Municipal Corporation of Delhi has been considered for the purpose of Urban Governance Index



### Key Observations

- The Mayor of Delhi is one of the least empowered since the Mayor does not have a term (currently set at one year) that is co-terminus with that of the City Government, no executive authority over commissioner, no authority to appoint chairperson of Standing/Subject Committee and the Mayor is also not the chairperson of the apex committee.
- Delhi does not have provision for training of Councillors or commensurate salary and office allowances. City Administration is also less empowered as the recruitment and training of officials is not with the City Government.
- To truly empower the city administration, all 18 functions listed under the 12th Schedule of 74th Constitutional Amendment Act should be devolved to the City Government. Currently Municipal Corporation of Delhi is involved in devolution of only 4 functions independently.

Delhi's Rank and overall Score have decreased. This is due to non-formation of Standing, Subject and Zonal Committees as well as unavailability of data on human resources. Another reason being other states have relatively improved their score.

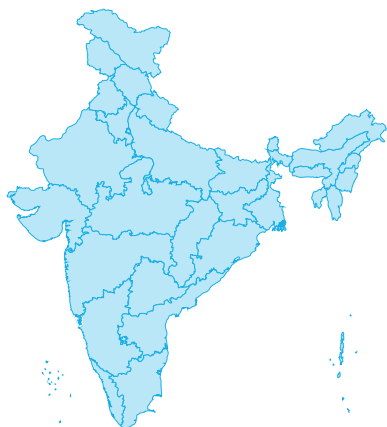

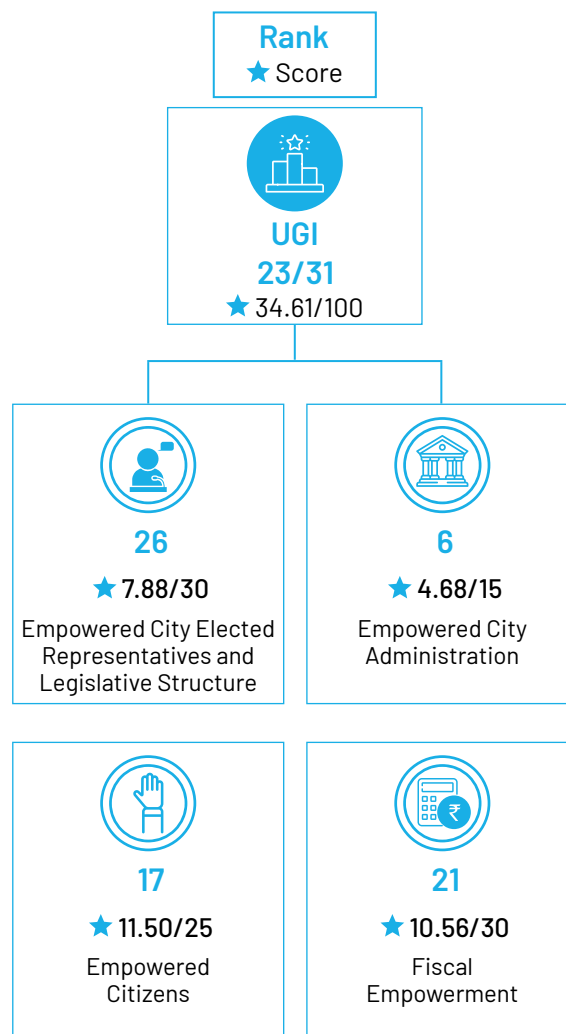

## Goa

Goa has two Acts for constitution of city governments namely City of Panaji Corporation Act 2002 and The Goa Municipalities Act, 1968. The CPCA, 2002 for the Corporation of the City of Panaji has been considered for the purpose of Urban Governance Index.



### Key Observations

- To improve the urban governance structure, Goa needs to ensure that the Mayoral term (currently set at one year) is co-terminus with that of the City Government. The Mayor should also have executive authority over the commissioner, the authority to appoint the chairpersons of subject or standing committees, and should serve as the chairperson of the apex committee.
- There is no provision for fixed salaries, office allowances, or for conducting training for Councillors.
- To improve the urban governance structure, Goa needs to have empowered council with authority to pass no confidence motion against the Mayor.
- The City Government should be given independent authority to introduce new taxes/charges as per the assigned list under the State Municipal Act and revise existing tax/charges.

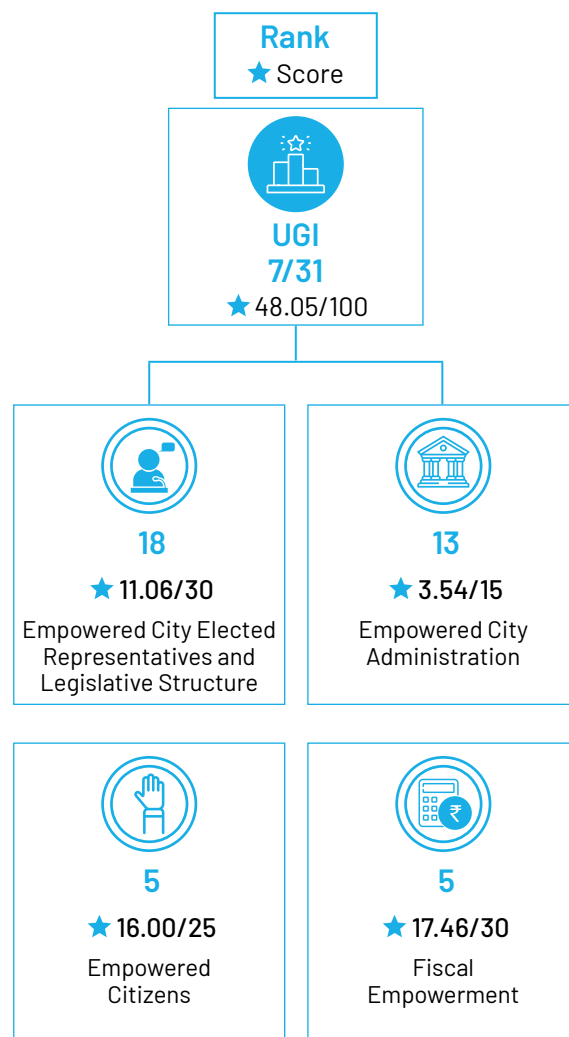

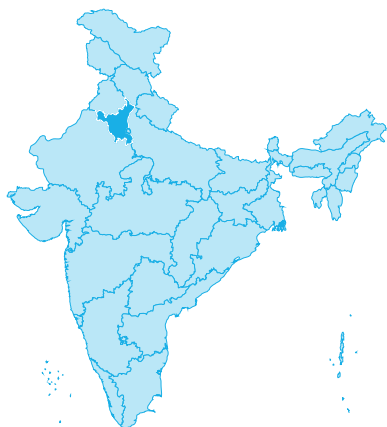

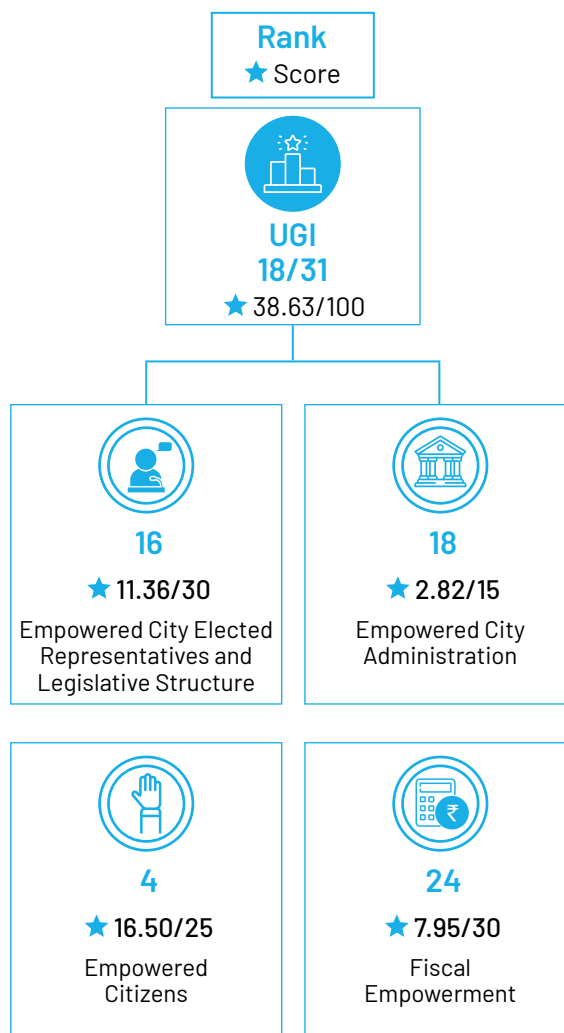

Haryana has two Acts for constitution of city governments namely Haryana Municipal Act, 1973 and Haryana Municipal Corporations Act, 1994. Municipal Corporation of Gurugram has been considered for the purpose of Urban Governance Index.



### Key Observations

- To empower the Mayor, Haryana should make provisions where the Mayor has executive authority over the commissioner, the authority to appoint the chairpersons of subject or standing committees, and should serve as the chairperson of the apex committee.
- The City Government needs to improve its open data portal and should regularly publish the accounts on their website.
- To enable fiscal empowerment of city government, the State Municipal Act should empower the city government to introduce new taxes and revise the existing ones.

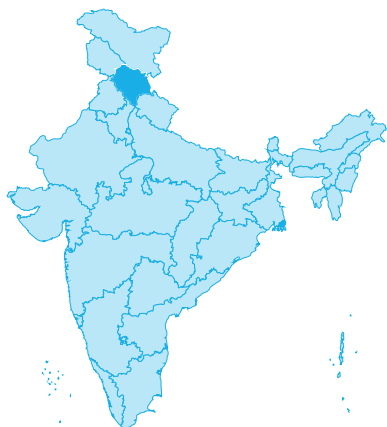

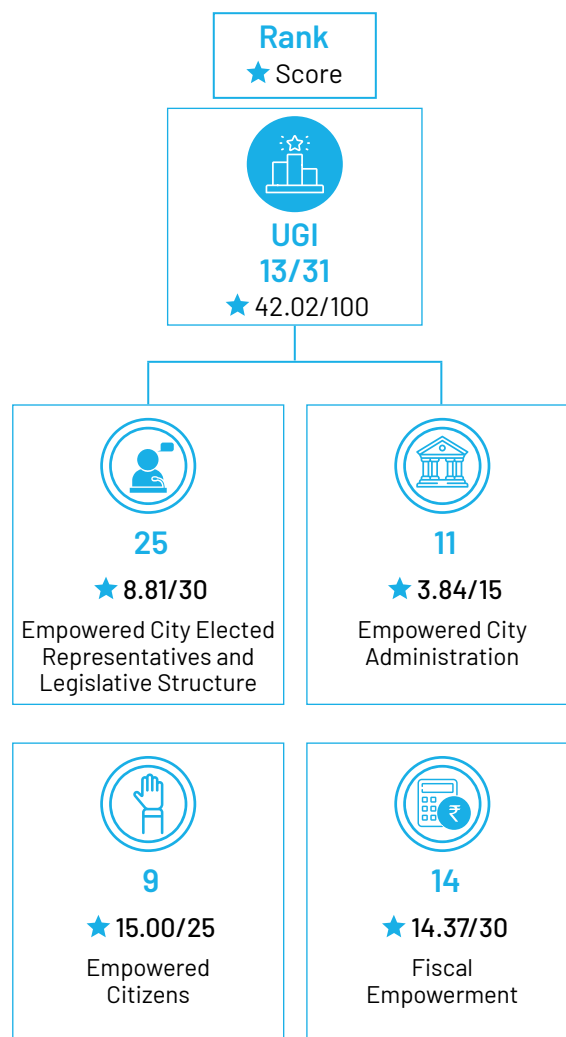

# Himachal Pradesh

Himachal Pradesh has two Acts for constitution of city governments namely The Himachal Pradesh Municipal Act, 1994 and Himachal Pradesh Municipal Corporation Act, 1994. Shimla Municipal Corporation has been considered for the purpose of Urban Governance Index.



## Key Observations

- To improve the urban governance structure, Himachal Pradesh needs to ensure that the Mayoral term (currently set at two and half years) is co-terminus with that of the City Government. The Mayor should also have executive authority over the commissioner, the authority to appoint the chairpersons of subject or standing committees, and should serve as the chairperson of the apex committee.
- The City government should have independent authority to frame rules, regulation and bye-laws and have a procedure for conduct and business rules for the City Government.
- The ward committees in Himachal Pradesh have provision for inclusion of 9 members nominated by the ward sabha ensuring empowerment of citizens. Additionally, 50 % of the seats are reserved for women.

## Karnataka

Karnataka has three Acts for constitution of city governments namely The Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike Act, 2020, Karnataka Municipal Corporations Act, 1976 and Karnataka Municipalities Act, 1964. Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike (i.e., Bengaluru City Municipal Corporation) and the corresponding Municipal Act i.e. The Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike Act, 2020 has been considered for the purpose of Urban Governance Index.



### Key Observations

- To improve the urban governance structure, Karnataka needs to ensure that the Mayoral term (currently set at one year) is co-terminus with that of the City Government. The Mayor should also have executive authority over the commissioner, the authority to appoint the chairpersons of subject or standing committees, and should serve as the chairperson of the apex committee.
- There is no provision for council to pass no confidence motion against the Mayor and no provision to hold municipal election before the expiry of the term of the corporation.
- To improve fiscal empowerment of city government, Karnataka should empower its city governments to approve their own budget.

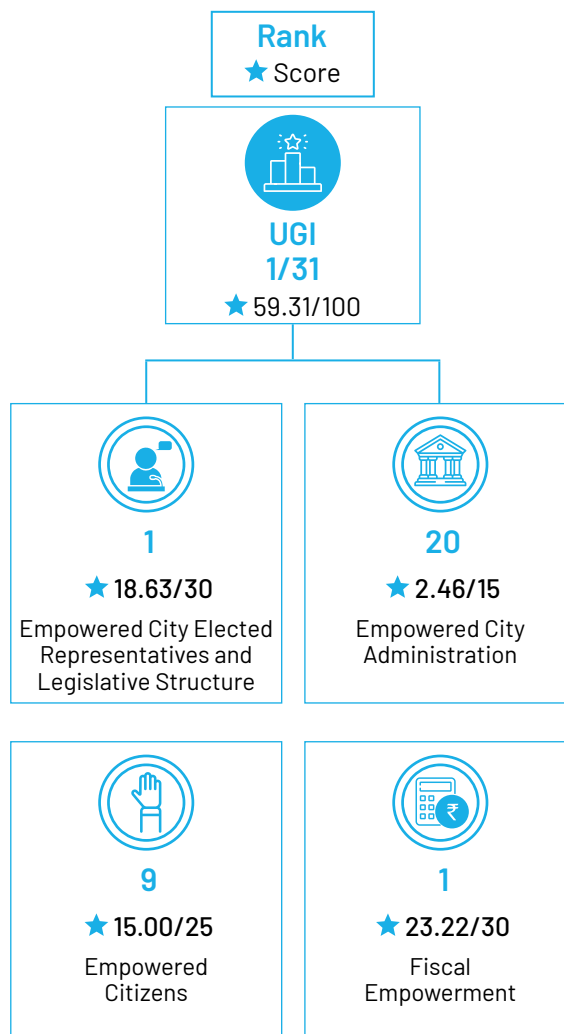

## Kerala

Kerala has Kerala Municipality Act, 1994 for constitution of city governments. Thiruvananthapuram Municipal Corporation has been considered for the purpose of Urban Governance Index.



### Key Observations

- Kerala ranked highest in Empowered City Elected Representatives and Legislative Structure (Score 18.63/30.00) and Fiscal Empowerment (Score 23.22/30.00). The Mayors in Kerala have the authority to write Annual Confidential Report (ACR) of the commissioner (named as secretary). The Act also has a provision to ensure all the Councillors are a part of at least one Subject/Standing committee.
- However, Kerala needs to empower the City Administration by devolving sanctioning authority for recruitment, ensuring provision for training of the city administration and devolution of all 18 functions listed under the 12th Schedule of the 74th Constitutional Amendment Act to the City Government.
- To ensure citizen empowerment Kerala should regularly publish audit report, minutes of meetings of the committees on the city government website.

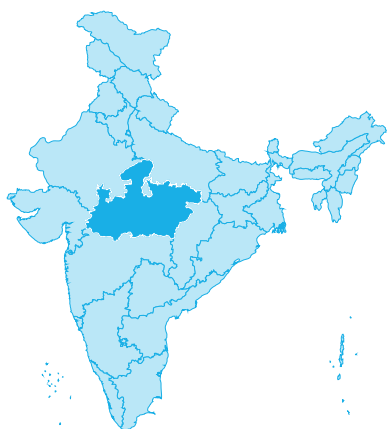

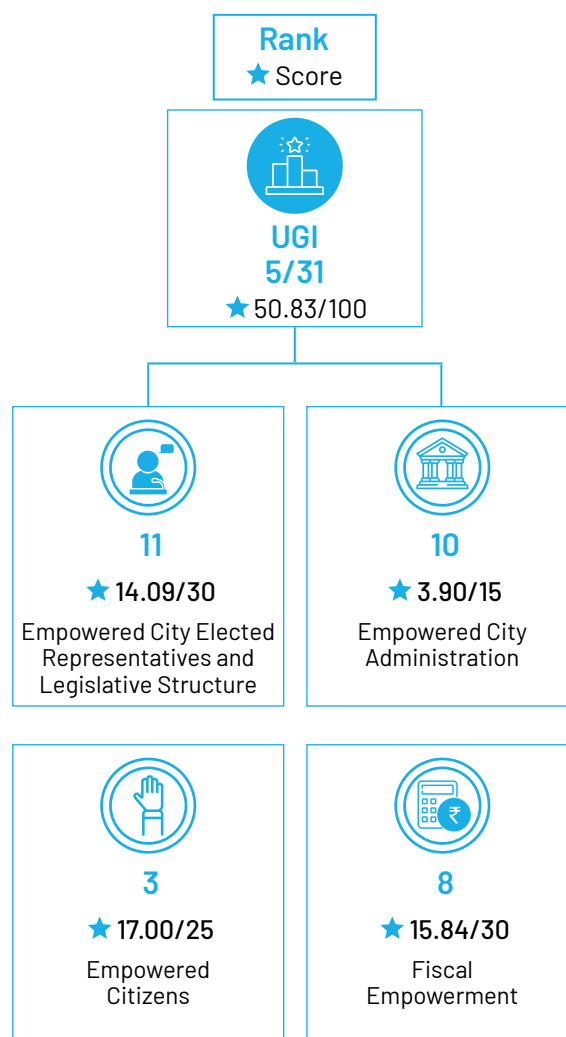

# Madhya Pradesh

Madhya Pradesh has two Acts for constitution of city governments namely The Madhya Pradesh Municipal Corporation Act, 1956 and Madhya Pradesh Municipalities Act, 1961. Bhopal Municipal Corporation has been considered for the purpose of Urban Governance Index.



## Key Observations

- Madhya Pradesh has a very robust deliberative committee but needs to include a provision for all committees to meet at least once a month.
- The City administration should hold sanctioning authority for recruitment, have a provision for providing training to the employees and devolve all 18 functions listed under the 12th Schedule of 74th Constitutional Amendment Act to the City Government.
- To improve its open data portal, city government should regularly publish minutes of committees and council meetings and its organisation structure along with a portal for citizens suggestions.

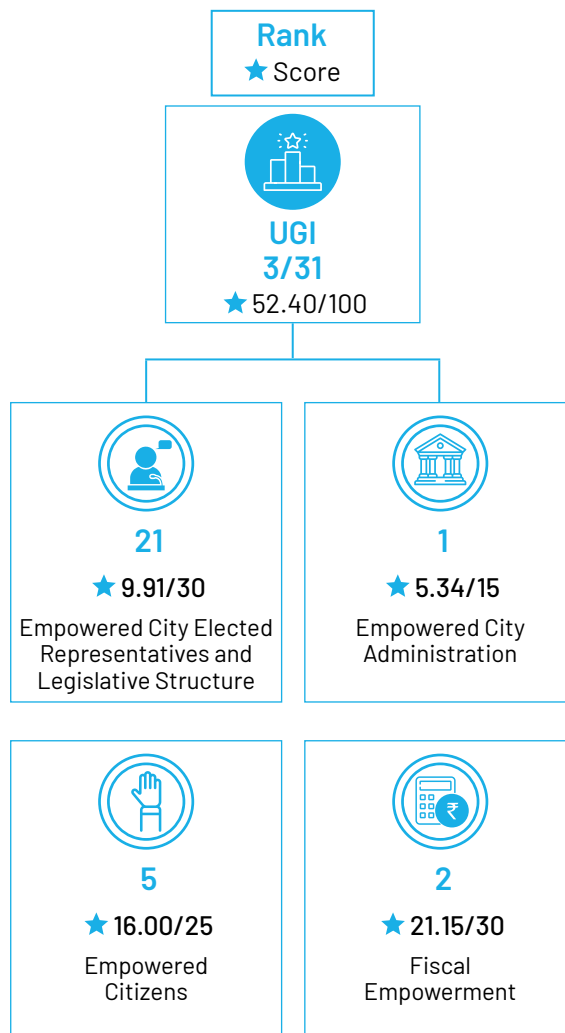
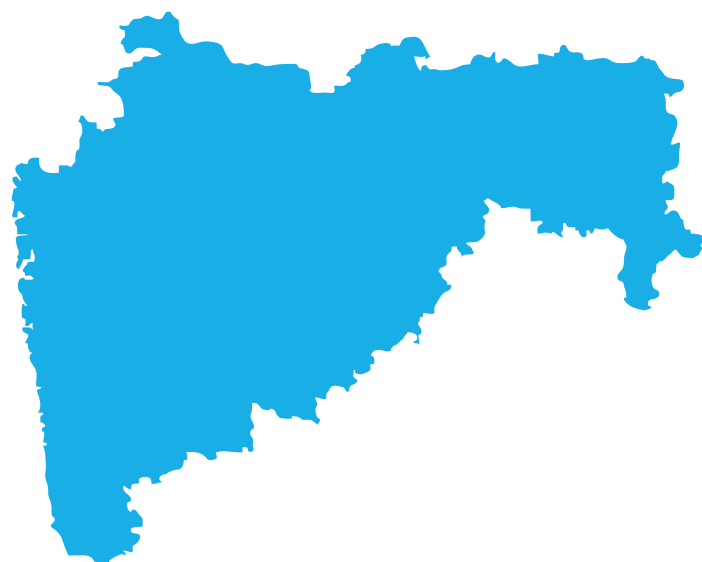

## Maharashtra

Maharashtra has three Acts for constitution of city governments namely The Maharashtra Municipal Corporations Act, 1949, The Mumbai Municipal Corporation Act, 1888 and Maharashtra Municipal Councils, Nagar Panchayats and Industrial Townships Act, 1965. Municipal Corporation of Greater Mumbai has been considered for the purpose of Urban Governance Index.



### Key Observations

- To improve the urban governance structure, Maharashtra needs to ensure that the Mayoral term (currently set at two and half years) is co-terminus with that of the City Government. The Mayor should also have executive authority over the commissioner, the authority to appoint the chairpersons of subject or standing committees, and should serve as the chairperson of the apex committee.
- This is the second instance since its formation that the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) is operating without an elected wing, with the last elected body having completed its term in February 2022.
- BMC stands out as the only municipal corporation that performs 11 out of the 18 functions under the 12th Schedule of the 74th Constitutional Amendment Act.
- City government in Maharashtra has adequate fiscal empowerment since the City Government has independent authority to introduce new taxes, change tax rates and approve the budget.

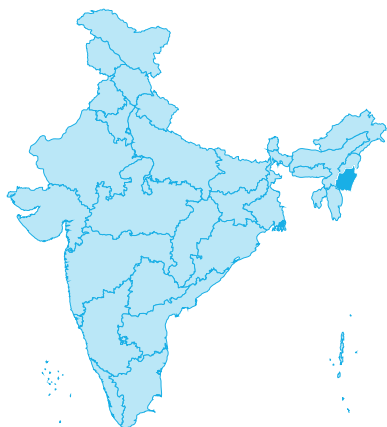

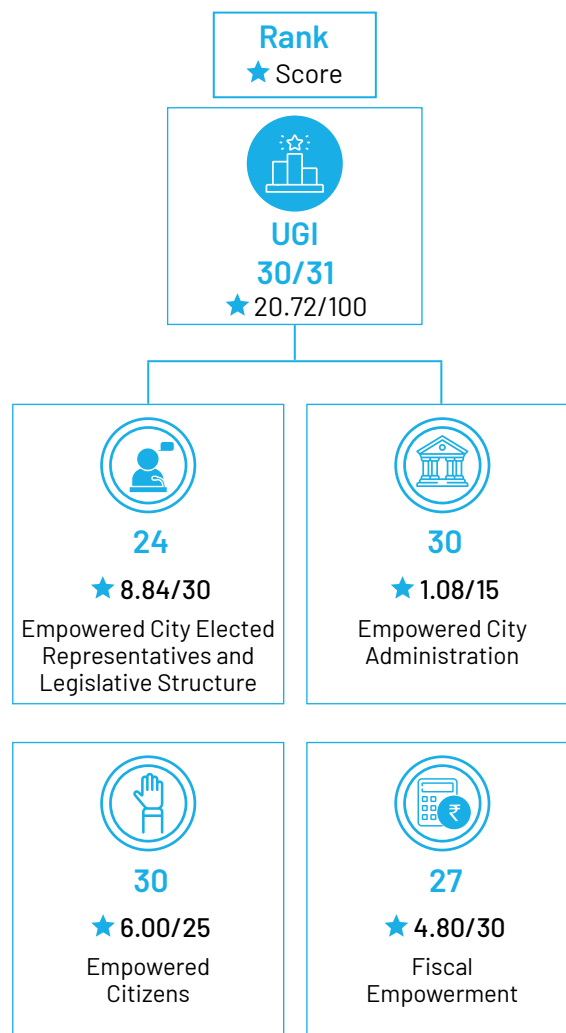

# Manipur

Manipur has The Manipur Municipalities Act, 1994 for constitution of city governments. Imphal Municipal Corporation has been considered for the purpose of Urban Governance Index.



## Key Observations

- To improve urban governance structure, the City administration should hold sanctioning authority for recruitment, have a provision for providing training to the employees and all 18 functions listed under the 12th Schedule of 74th Constitutional Amendment Act should be devolved to the City Government.
- The City Governments should have an accessible open data portal for the citizens.
- The Manipur Municipality Community Participation Act, 2010 has a provision for establishing Ward Development Committees. The Ward Development Committee consists of the ward councillor as the chairperson, two persons elected from the ward and two persons representing the civil society nominated by the State Government. The duration of the Ward Development Committee is co-terminus with the city government. The last elections to the Ward Development Committee were held along with the Municipal Corporation elections.

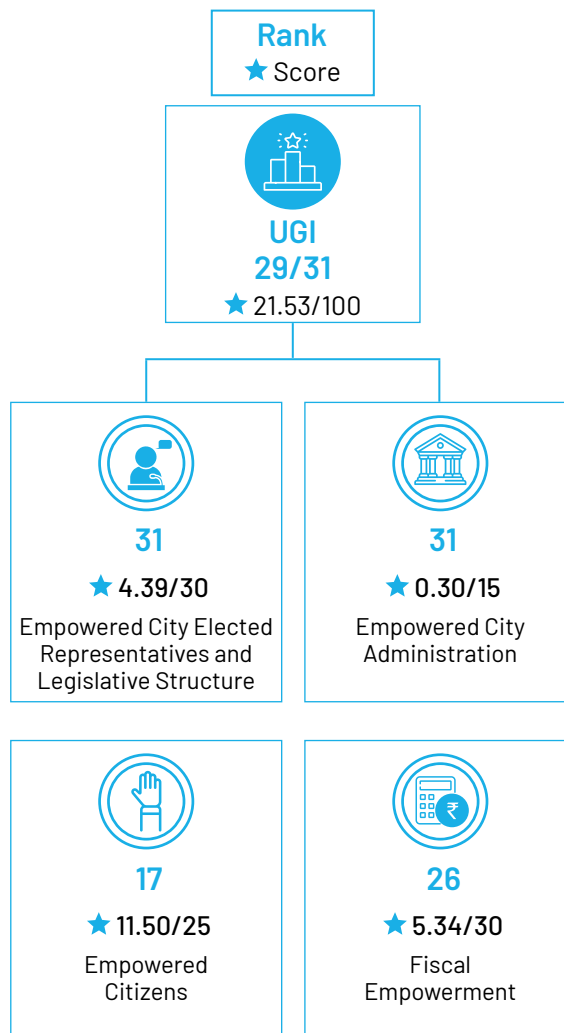

## Meghalaya

Meghalaya has The Meghalaya Municipal Act, 1973 for constitution of city governments. Shillong Municipal Board has been considered for the purpose of Urban Governance Index.



### Key Observations

- There is no elected body in Shillong; municipal elections should be held at the earliest possible time to have a democratically functional municipality. Citizen participation is enabled through traditional forums like Durbar Shnongs, headed by a Rangbah Shnong (headman). The headman is elected by adult members of the Durbar Shnong.
- The City administration should hold sanctioning authority for recruitment, have a provision for providing training to the employees and all 18 functions listed under the 12th Schedule of 74th Constitutional Amendment Act should be devolved to the City Government.
- The City Governments should have an accessible open data portal for the citizens along with a robust digital grievance redressal mechanism with multiple modes of complaint registration.

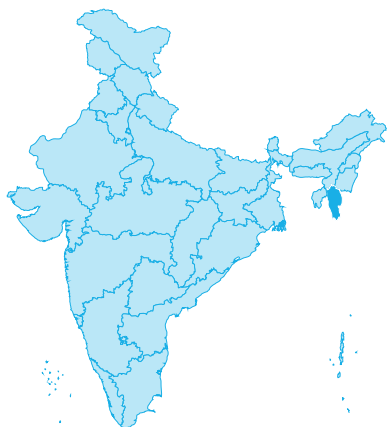

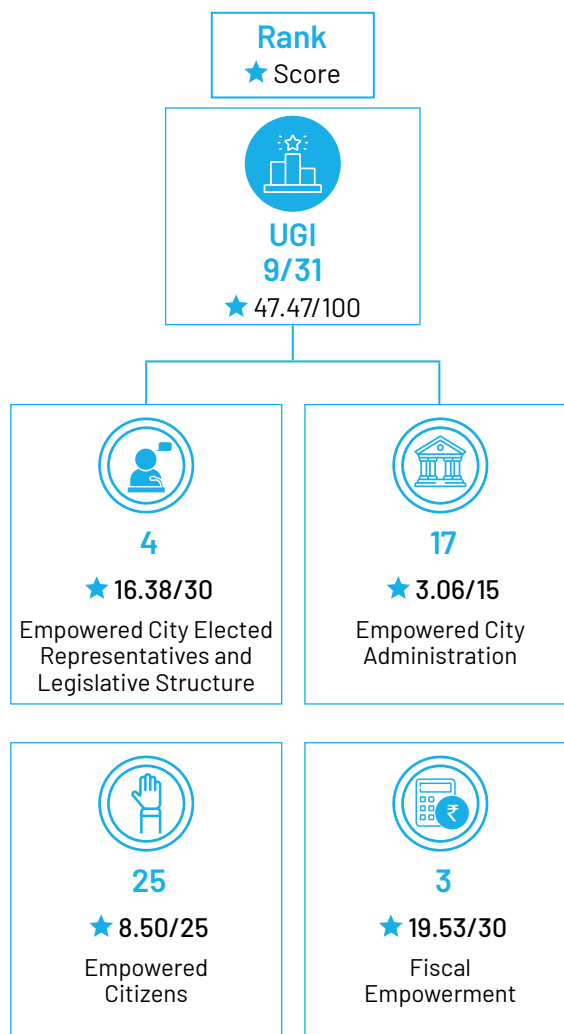

- In the theme of Empowered Citizens it has secured 25th rank (Score 8.50/25.00) The citizens should have a robust open data portal with access to annual reports, an active grievance redressal system and information about schemes and programs.
- Mizoram has an autonomous body to look into the matters concerning recruitment of municipal officials for the city governments.

This portal features an issue-specific dropdown menu, enabling residents to effectively communicate their service-related needs to the BMC.
- The council should have authority to sanction recruitments and provide training for administration.
- The citizens should have the right to recall a Councillor.

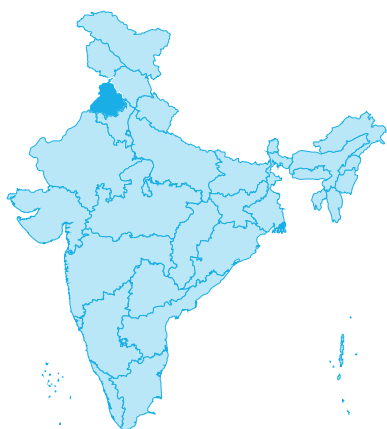

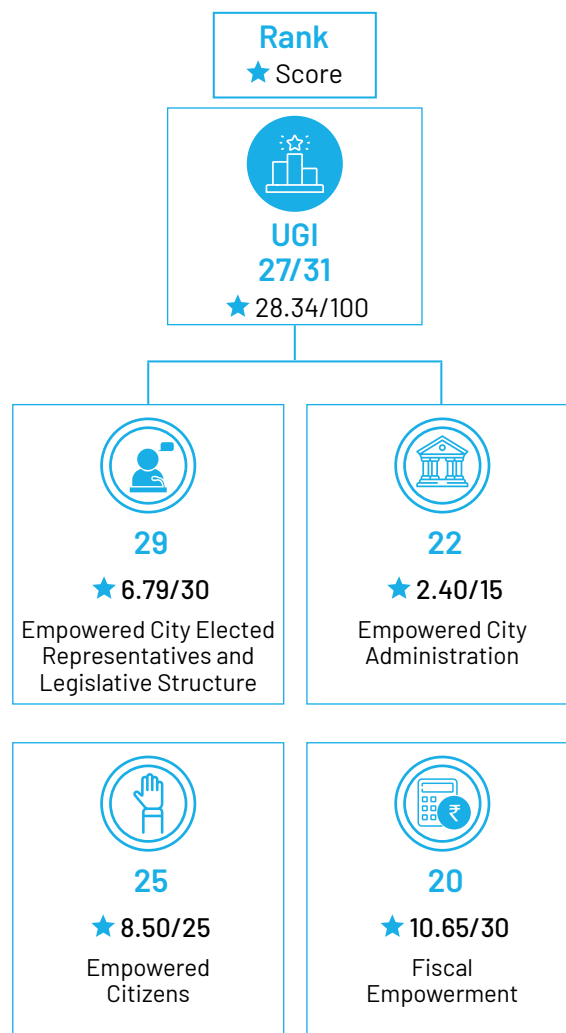

## Punjab

Punjab has two Acts for constitution of city governments namely Punjab Municipal Corporation Act, 1976 and the Punjab Municipal Act, 1911. Municipal Corporation Amritsar has been considered for the purpose of Urban Governance Index.



### Key Observations

- To improve the urban governance structure, Punjab needs to ensure that the Mayor holds executive authority over commissioner along with authority to appoint chairperson of subject/standing committee and also ensure that the Mayor is the chairperson of apex committee.
- There should be a provision for each Councillor to be part of at least one deliberative committee, and Councillors should receive regular training, commensurate salaries, and office allowances.
- The state should empower the City Government with authority to introduce new taxes/charges and change tax rates, and have independent authority to approve the budget according to the State Municipal Act.

- To improve the urban governance structure, Tamil Nadu needs to ensure that the Mayor should hold executive authority over commissioner, along with authority to appoint chairperson of subject/standing committee and Mayor should be the chairperson of apex committee.
- There should be a provision for each Councillor to be part of at least one deliberative committee, and Councillors should receive training, commensurate salaries, and office allowances.

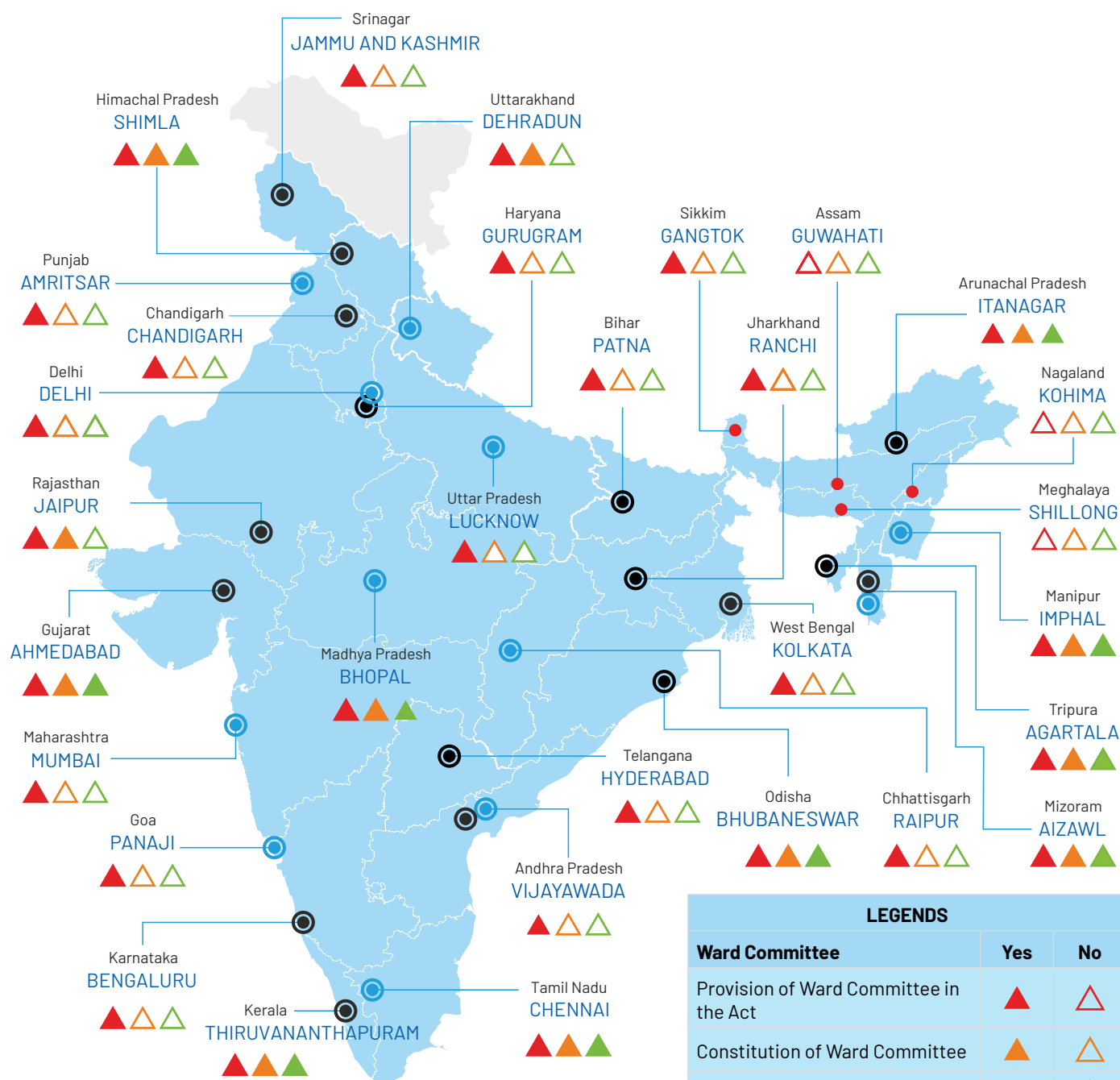

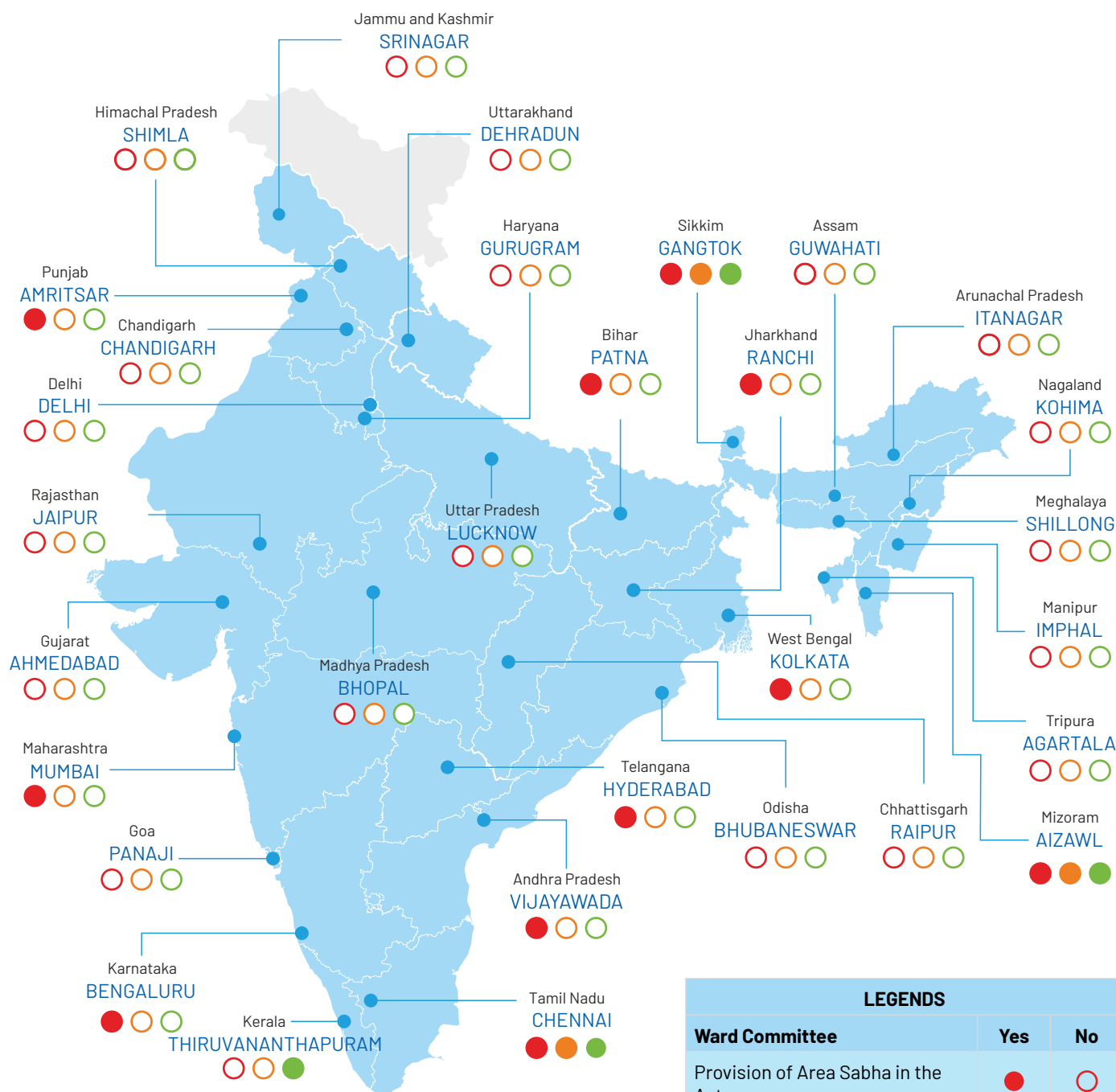

#### INSIGHTS :

- Assam, Meghalaya & Nagaland do not have provision for formation of Ward(s) Committees in the State Municipal Act.
- Ward(s) committee have been constituted in only 12 cities viz., Itanagar, Ahmedabad, Shimla, Thiruvananthapuram, Bhopal, Imphal, Aizawl, Bhubaneswar, Jaipur, Chennai, Agartala & Dehradun.
- Out of the 12 cities which have constituted ward(s) committee only 10 cities viz., Itanagar, Ahmedabad, Shimla, Thiruvananthapuram, Bhopal, Imphal, Aizawl, Bhubaneswar, Chennai & Agartala have a functional ward(s) committee.

### INSIGHTS :

- 11 cities viz., Vijayawada, Patna, Ranchi, Bengaluru, Mumbai, Aizawl, Amritsar, Gangtok, Chennai, Hyderabad & Kolkata have a provision for constitution of area sabhas in their State Municipal Act.
- Only 3 cities viz., Aizawl, Gangtok & Chennai have constituted functional area sabhas.
- Although Thiruvananthapuram does not have a provision for constitution of area sabhas, they have a unique public participation mechanism known as Janakeeyasoothranam (People's Planning Campaign) with its own structure.
- There are no provisions for Area Sabhas in the Municipal Acts of Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Chandigarh, Chattisgarh, Delhi, Goa, Gujarat, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu and Kashmir, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Manipur, Meghalaya, Nagaland, Odisha, Rajasthan, Tripura, Uttar Pradesh & Uttarakhand.



### 6.7.3. STATUS OF KEY DELIBERATIVE BODIES AND SUBJECT COMMITTEES

Councillors mainly hold an advisory role in the governance processes as the elected representatives of the people. Their engagement in the decision-making process of the municipal corporation is crucial while making public decisions. Deliberations and decision-making are done through key deliberative bodies such as the Mayor-in-Council system, empowered Standing Committees, function-based Standing Committees, Executive Committees, etc. (terminology varies from state to state) and various Subject Committees, i.e., committees constituted on specific subjects. Councillors should be part of at least one of the committees during their term; either Standing Committees or Subject Committees that will effectively enable them to participate in the decision-making process for the city, initiate proposals for the development of wards, and discuss issues faced by people from their respective wards.

#### Key Deliberative Body

- 21 out of 31 cities have actively functioning key deliberative bodies in the city government. Out of these, Agartala, Guwahati, Bhopal, Kolkata, and Raipur have an actively functioning Mayor-in-Council system. 10 cities, viz Agartala, Ahmedabad, Aizawl, Raipur, Itanagar, Guwahati, Jaipur, Shimla, Thiruvananthapuram, Bhopal, Bhubaneswar, Gangtok, Chennai, Hyderabad, Panaji, Kolkata, Kohima and Vijayawada have not constituted key deliberative bodies.
- City governments in Mumbai, Gurugram, Imphal, Srinagar, Shillong, Ranchi, Amritsar, and Bengaluru have provisions to constitute key deliberative bodies, however, municipal elections in these cities are currently pending. Hence, the bodies have not been constituted. Delhi too has a similar provision. There is an elected body, but the Apex Committee as well as other Statutory Committees have not been formed.
- Kohima recently conducted elections for the city government, wherein the State Municipal Act does not make the provision for constituting key deliberative bodies.

#### Subject Committees

- City Governments in Patna, Chandigarh, Delhi, Lucknow and Dehradun have not constituted Subject Committees despite Municipal Acts from the respective states having the provision. Additionally, 9 cities (Gurugram, Srinagar, Ranchi, Bengaluru, Mumbai, Imphal, Shillong, Amritsar and Dehradun) where city government elections are pending have not constituted subject committees.
- 17 city governments out of 31 have actively functioning Subject Committees. These cities are; Agartala, Ahmedabad, Aizawl, Raipur, Itanagar, Guwahati, Jaipur, Shimla, Thiruvananthapuram, Bhopal, Bhubaneswar, Gangtok, Chennai, Hyderabad, Panaji, Kolkata, and Vijayawada.

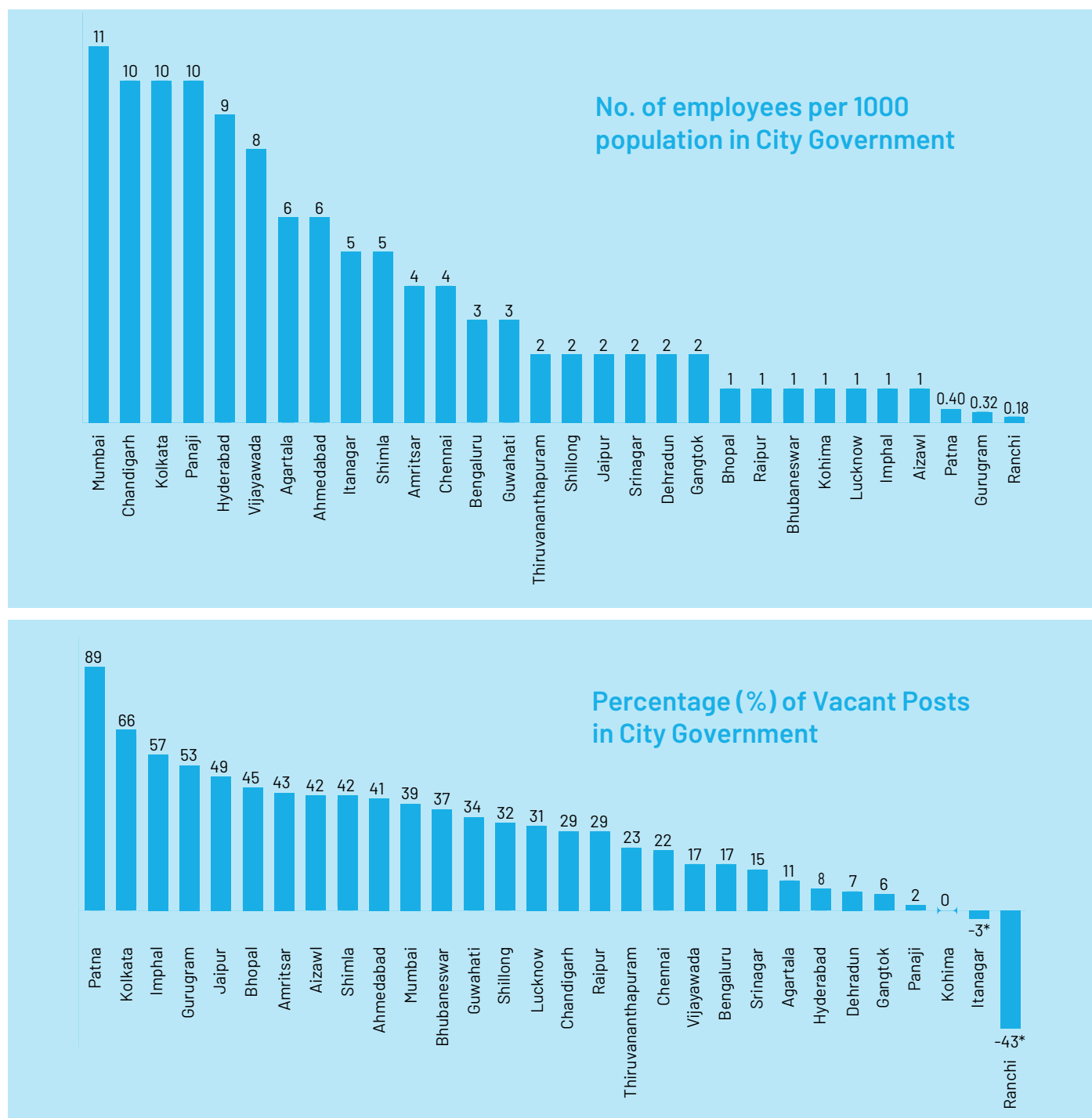

- Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation has the highest number of municipal employees to city's population ratio among all 31 cities i.e. 11 employees per 1000 population.
- Patna Municipal Corporation records the highest percentage of vacant positions among 31 cities. 89% of the total sanctioned positions are currently vacant.
- Three Municipal Corporations- Patna (0.40), Gurugram (0.32) and Ranchi (0.18) do not have even 1 employee per 1000 population.
- Municipal Corporation of Delhi could not provide records of current employees within the Municipal Corporation as it does not have a centralised database of Human Resources. Hence, it could not be considered.
- Two Municipal Corporations- Itanagar and Ranchi have an excess number of employees than the total sanctioned positions. Ranchi has reduced the number of sanctioned positions in 2018 which led to a surplus.
